Call to Order – S. Snodgrass called the meeting to order at 9:03 a.m.

Approval of Agenda

Motion: MSC: D. Heald , C. Biancalana. The committee voted unanimously to approve the Executive Committee agenda.

Recognition of the Board Members Terming Off

Jess Brown and Pegi Ard's terms are expiring at the end of the fiscal year. S. Snodgrass recognized and thanked Jess and Pegi for their support and service on the Board of Directors and Executive Committee.

Public Comment Opportunity

There were no members of the public in attendance.

Approve Executive Committee Minutes

Motion: MSC: C. Biancalana /R. Spencer. Pegi Ard, Claire Biancalana, Jess Brown, Owen Brown, William Ow, Steve Snodgrass, Rachael Spencer voted to approve the Executive Committee Minutes of January 19, 2017. Alan Aman, Linda Burroughs, David Heald and Leola Lapides abstained, Laurel Jones was absent.

Cabrillo College Report

E. Hill reported that the Cabrillo College Community Forum Report Out will be taking place on Monday, May1st at 7:00 pm in Samper Recital Hall. There will be a summary of the results of the six Forums held throughout Santa Cruz County. E. Hill reported that Cabrillo College was selected to be 1 of 20 California Community Colleges to participate in the Guided Pathways model which is a plan that guides a student into and through college with a specific pathway of prescribed classes that results in a faster completion of a credential and the transition to a university or the labor market. Guided Pathways will involve restructuring the class sequencing, class availability, and role of the counselor.

Executive Director Report

E. Hill reported that the Foundation is \$45,000 away from the \$3M annual goal. The President's Circle Campaign has surpassed its goal with \$330,000 raised. The 2017 WES campaign has launched.

Website reconstruction is a Foundation goal for the upcoming year. The goal is to make the website mobile friendly, ADA compliant, and improve ease of online giving. Ultimately the Foundation would like to conduct an online giving day to engage younger donors and Cabrillo faculty and staff.

Approve Financial Statements

The Finance Committee reviewed the January 31, 2017 Financial Statements. As of January 31, 2017 the total assets were \$30.1M and the ending net assets were \$29.1M. The total revenue for unrestricted, non-endowed and endowed funds was \$3.5M. Total expenses were \$1.8M with a net surplus for all funds of \$1.7M. The total operating revenue was \$602K and expenses \$557K. The operating deficit was \$48K.

Motion: MSC: P. Ard/J. Brown. The committee voted unanimously to approve the January 31, 2017 Financial Statements.

Approve 2017-18 Operating Budget

The Finance Committee reviewed the 2017-18 Draft Budget Overview and Salary Schedules. The Executive Committee recommended that the website reconstruction budget be increased to up to \$35K. This will result in a \$981,423 budget for 2017-18 and there will be a projected deficit of \$10K.

Motion: MSC: R. Spencer/C. Biancalana. The committee voted unanimously to approve the proposed 2017-18 Operating Budget with an amendment to increase the budget by \$10K for website reconstruction and the 2017-18 Administrative Salary Schedule and 2017-18 Clerical Salary Schedule.

Fundraising Goal

E.Hill reported that the Foundation has a fundraising goal of \$3M for outright and unbooked planned gifts for 2017-18.

Motion: MSC: D. Heald/L. Lapides. The committee voted unanimously to approve the 2017-18 Fundraising Goal of \$3M for outright and unbooked planned gifts.

Ratify Insurance Broker Selecion

The Ad-Hoc Insurance Committee reviewed the proposals received and approved ANB Insurance as our new Insurance Broker. The policies have been renewed and extended to 7/1/17 (except for the D & O policy which is 7/1/18). ANB will work with the Cabrillo College Foundation to make any recommended changes for the next policy period.

Motion: MSC: L. Burroughs/O. Brown. The committee voted unanimously to approve and ratify the Insurance Broker selection of ANB Insurance Services.

Review Nominations Committee Recommendations

The Nominating Committee met on March 1, 2017 to discuss prospective Board members, officers, and Audit Committee members. The goal was to add three to five new members to the Board. The following update shows the Committee's recommendations.

Biancalana. The committee voted unanimously to approve the updated Cabrillo College Foundation Personnel Policy Handbook.

Net Assets, Endowed Net Assets and Historical Gifts Chart

The ending net assets balance as of January 31, 2017 was \$29,106,923. The highest net assets level was \$29,106,923 as of January 31, 2017. The endowed net assets balance was \$25,192,575, the highest net assets balance reported. The endowed historical gifts value was \$20,493,383, the highest reported by the Cabrillo College Foundation.

EEO Fund Allocation for Fiscal Year 2017-2018: \$50,000...

Cabrillo College will receive \$50,000 in EEO funds from the state this year for EEO purposes. This is fantastic news! BIG HUGE THANKS AND CONGRATS TO HILDA MONTANEZ for her excellent work on the EEO front and ensuring that Cabrillo College met or exceeded the Multiple Methods EEO compliance benchmarks, preparing the report and updating the EEO plan.



Cabrillo has announced that under the guidelines of the California Department of Social Services (CDSS) ACL 17-05 and in cooperation with the County of Santa Cruz Human Services Department (HSD), we have been able to gain state approval for CalFresh Work Exemptions for students in the following

programs: ACE * AMAP * ASC * BIW * EOPS/ CARE * Guardian Scholars * MESA * Puente * WIOA, as well as students who Receive a Cal Grant A and meet certain requirements and students who

are approved for Federal Work Study. These changes will greatly increase the number of Cabrillo College students who may qualify for CalFresh with a

work requirement waiver. Students may apply online, via phone, or may come into the Student Re-

source & Support Network.

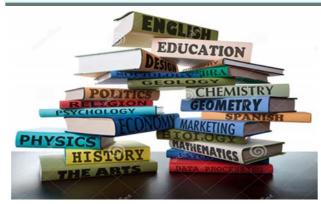


Culinary Arts...

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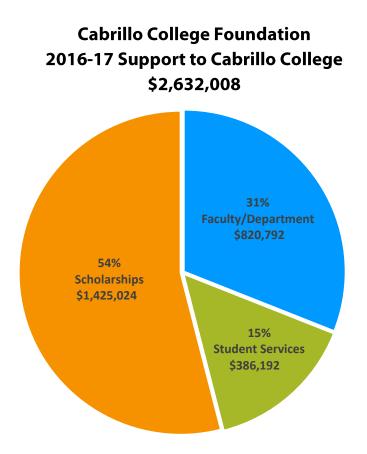

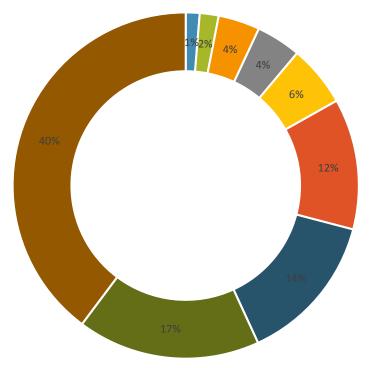

(1) Balance Sheet

• Total Assets:

Total assets of \$31.6M are \$2.1M over prior year due to positive investment results, receipt of pledge payments and higher contributed income.

• Receivables:

Total pledges receivable are \$848K less than prior year. The Cabrillo College Foundation has five multi-year pledges that were completed in the 2016-17 fiscal year. Pledges receivable will continue to decline until new pledges or bequests are received.

• Liabilities:

Liabilities of \$1.9M are consistent with prior year.

• Net Assets:

Total net assets of \$29.7M are \$2.3M over prior year.

(2) Income Statement

• Revenue:

Earned income as of June 30, 2017 is \$3.7M compared to the prior year balance of \$279K. Contributed income of \$2.4M is \$1.8M under prior year contributions primarily due to the \$1.3M bequest received from the estate of Leonard "Rod" Lundquist.

• Surplus/Deficit:

As of June 30, 2017, the Cabrillo College Foundation has a \$2.2M surplus over the prior year \$1.1M surplus due to a much better investment return in 16-17.

(3) Operational Budget to Actual

• Revenue:

Operating revenue of \$1.0M is \$72K favorable vs budget.

• Expenses:

Operating expenses of \$937K are \$23K favorable vs projection.

• Surplus/Deficit:

The operating fund surplus is \$95,766 prior to audit. This number will change when the annual adjustments for the CalPERS liability and the Retiree Medical Insurance liability are calculated during the course of the audit. Any surplus will be used to fulfill the goal of having 6 months of operating reserve. We have approximately 67% of our operating reserve goal).

- College Programs: 89 departments and programs were supported through the Foundation. Programs such as Athletics, the Stroke Center, Cabrillo Stage, Nursing, and our Foster Youth program received \$40,000-\$200,000 in support this year.
- Planned Giving: We added \$800,000 in unbooked planned gifts, secured a new gift annuity, and became named as a life insurance beneficiary.

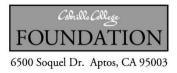

Cabrillo Advancement Program Overview

The Cabrillo Advancement Program (CAP) is a scholarship and support program designed to increase the academic success of high risk, low income students and to support their preparation for attending college. Sponsored by Cabrillo College and the Cabrillo College Foundation, the CAP program provides academic support and awards college scholarships to sixth graders from local Santa Cruz County schools.

CAP began in 1991 and has grown to include 350 participants in 12 schools throughout Santa Cruz County. CAP scholars are selected through a competitive process open to students who qualify for free or reduced lunches under Federal guidelines, show academic potential, and have a good school attendance record. As a part of the application process, students are required to write a personal essay describing their goals and interests. Beginning with the first year of middle school and continuing through high school, CAP students and their parents are offered comprehensive college preparation information and services. Students receive after-school tutoring and participate in counseling and extra-curricular activities that sustain their commitment to preparing for college. Students who complete CAP receive \$2,000 in scholarships upon high school graduation for their first and second year at Cabrillo.

Request

The CAP Committee has asked the Executive Committee to consider awarding CAP students who enroll full-time directly to a four year college their \$1,000 scholarship.

Funding

In addition to on-going fundraising that is conducted each year for the CAP Program, the following endowment funds provide sustainable funding:

CAP Program Endowment

Historical Gift Value \$2,327, 671 Estimated Annual Payout \$93,106

CAP Scholarship Endowment (multiple endowments to support CAP Scholarships) Historical Gift Value \$1,113,998 Estimated Annual Payout \$44,559

Historical Gift Value \$400,000 Estimated Annual Payout \$16,000

Challenge

CAP has shown amazing success in high school graduation and college-going rates compared to similar populations. Based on self-reported data we have received from the 2017 graduating class, 85% CAP high school seniors will be graduating and going to college (either Cabrillo College or directly to a four-year university), exceeding the college-going benchmark of 49% by 36%. CAP is proud to have achieved a 36% college-going rate increase compared to the benchmark. The comprehensive college preparation, tutoring, mentoring, counseling, and extra-curricular activities these low-income CAP students receive are preparing students for college. Most of these students are the first in their families to attend college, and often their younger siblings follow in their footsteps.

An average of 13 students each year indicate they will be going directly to a four year college. CAP Scholarship have been structured to be awarded to students who enroll full-time at Cabrillo College following their senior year in high school. Students who go directly to a four year school do not receive their scholarship award.

Based on the five year average of first year scholarships awarded, there is \$21,000 in scholarship funding that is rolled over to the following year. Based on the five year average of second year scholarships awarded, there is \$4,000 in scholarship funding that is rolled over to the following year.



CONFLICT OF INTEREST POLICY AND FORM

The Cabrillo College Foundation provides the following policy to insure that any financial decision made by directors, officers of the Foundation, or employees is made free of favoritism or conflict of interest and is based entirely on merit:

- Every director of the Foundation and every non-director who is an officer of the Foundation, or employee ("director, officer, or employee") shall complete a Conflict of Interest Statement in the form attached and submit to the board of the Foundation promptly as soon as the director, officer, or employee takes on such position and annually thereafter by the first quarterly board meeting.
- 2. Notwithstanding the completion of the annual Conflict of Interest Statement, whenever a director, officer, or employee (or his or her family member or business associate, as defined in paragraph 3) contemplates entering into a business or financial relationship with the Foundation, such director, officer, or employee will
 - a. disclose the possible relationship and the material facts involved in it to the board of directors of the Foundation,
 - b. answer any questions from other board members or staff about the potential relationship, but otherwise not participate in discussion,
 - c. leave the room to allow the board to complete its discussion and vote, and
 - d. be ineligible to vote on the matter.
- 3. Approval of the transaction shall require the affirmative vote of a majority of the directors then in office (not counting the vote of the conflicted director), and such directors must, prior to voting, have knowledge of the material facts concerning the transaction and the conflicted director's interest in it. A conflicted director may be counted toward the quorum for a meeting of the board.
- 4. For purposes of this policy, family members consist of the spouse, dependent children, and any relative living in the household of the director, officer, or employee; and business associates consist of any partner of a partnership or co-owner of a privately held business, whether corporation or sole proprietorship or other form, of which the director, officer, or employee, (or his or her family member) is also a partner or co-owner.
- As required by Section 5233 of the California Corporations Code, the Foundation shall not enter into a business or financial relationship as described in paragraph 2 unless the board first determines that
 - a. the transaction is for the Foundation's own benefit,

- b. the transaction is fair and reasonable to the Foundation at the time the Foundation enters into it,
- c. the board considered and in good faith determined after reasonable investigation under the circumstances that the Foundation could not have obtained a more advantageous arrangement with reasonable effort under the circumstances.
- 6. Family members and business associates of a director, officer, or employee may be unpaid volunteers for the Foundation but may not be employees of the Foundation or otherwise paid work done for the Foundation without compliance with paragraphs 2 and 4.
- 7. A director who occupies the position of unpaid director, officer, trustee, or other unpaid position of another charitable corporation or organization or of a governmental entity will not be deemed, because of such position, to have a conflict of interest with respect to transactions between the Foundation and such other corporation, entity, or organization. However, any such director shall disclose such relationship at the outset (or as soon thereafter as reasonably possible) of any discussion by the Foundation board of such a transaction and shall, if the Foundation board so requests (by majority vote of the other directors then present and voting), refrain from voting on such transaction.
- 8. The provisions of this resolution shall also apply to matters arising before the Executive, Finance, and Audit committee of the board as well as before the board itself; and in such circumstances, references to the "board" will refer to those committees and the board itself.

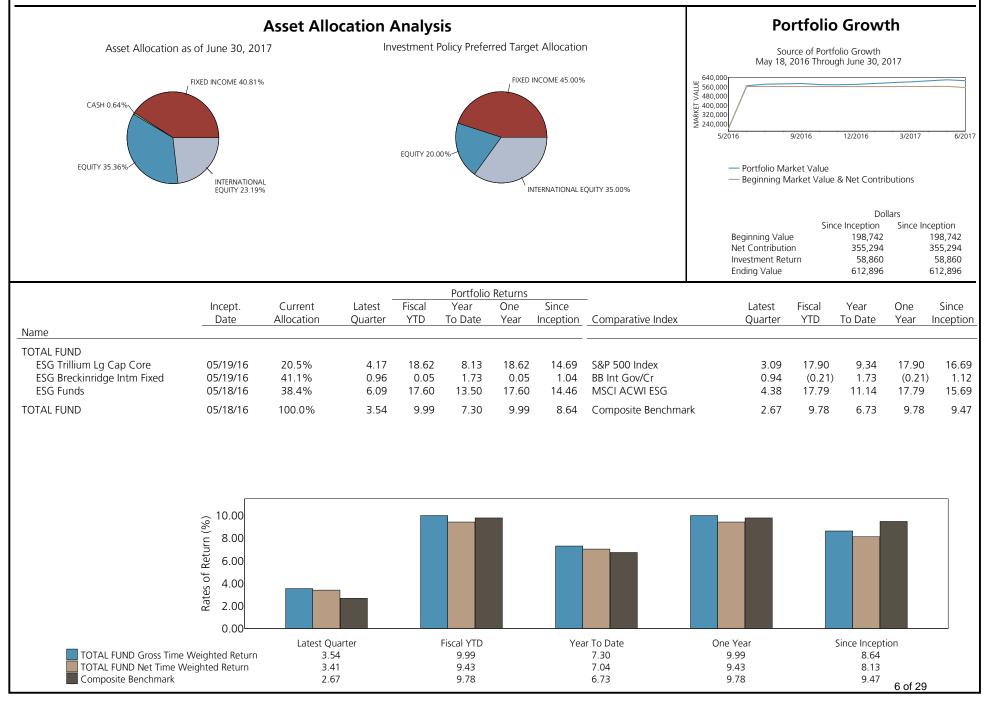

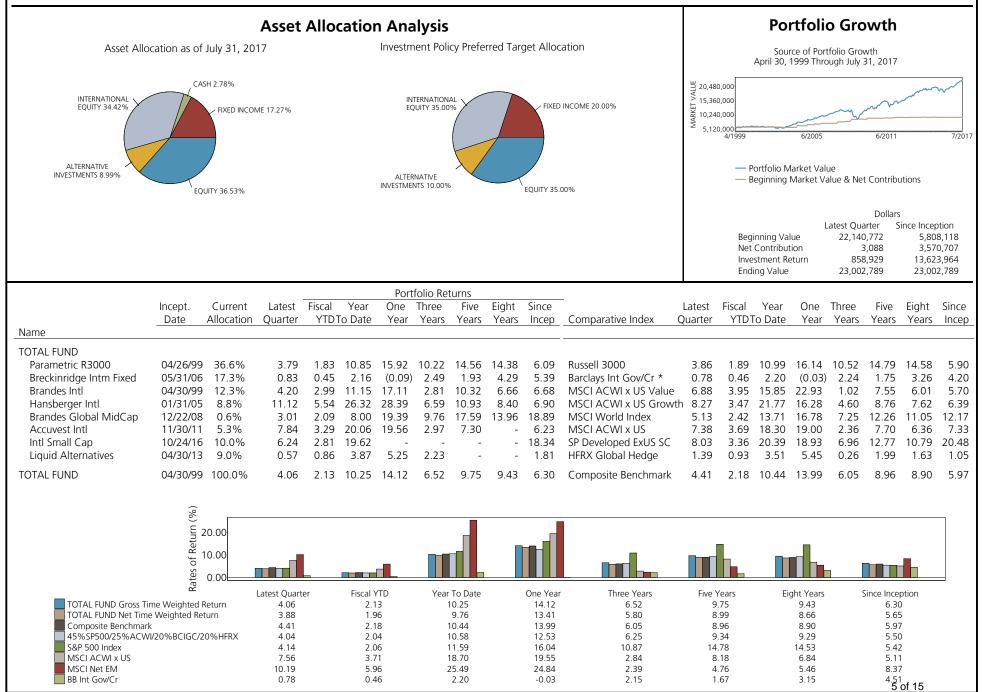

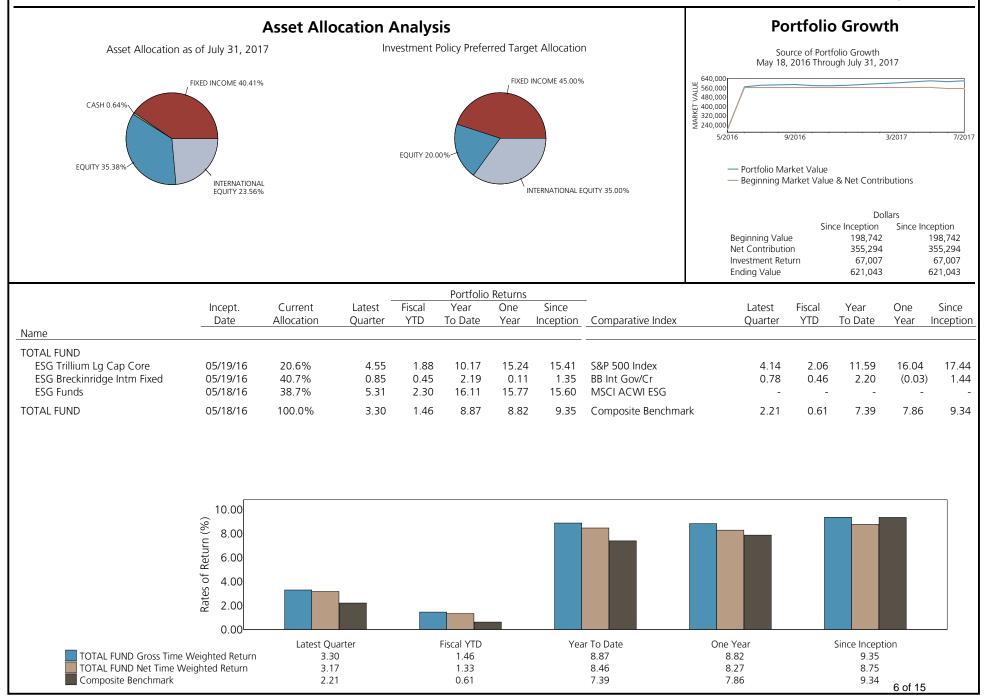

SUBJECT:

Cabrillo College faculty: Faculty Grants for Student Success, Crocker Endowment Grants, and the Engineering and Applied Science Endowment. Grant recipients are selected through an annual proposal process.

Last year, \$54,556 was awarded to Cabrillo faculty to enhance student learning, and this year, there is \$59,653 available to award to faculty to increase student success. In November, a committee of five Foundation Board Members and five Cabrillo faculty will review proposals and select projects to award. Projects funded last year are listed below.

2016-17 Faculty and Staff Grants
