Call to Order - L. Lapides called the meeting to order at 9:08 a.m.

## Approval of Agenda

Motion: MSC: S. Snodgrass, R. Spencer. The committee voted unanimously to approve the Executive Committee agenda.

## Public Comment Opportunity

Bob Shepherd, a member of the Finance and Investments Committee, attended the meeting but had no comments.

## Approve Executive Committee Minutes

Motion: MSC: R. Spencer / C. Biancalana. Alan Aman, Claire Biancalana, Laurel Jones, Steve Snodgrass and Rachael Spencer voted to approve the Executive Committee Minutes of August 30, 2017. Owen Brown and William Ow abstained. Linda Burroughs and David Heald were absent.

## Cabrillo College Report

L. Jones outlined three initiatives of Cabrillo College. The first is to accelerate students' basic skills in the first year at Cabrillo. Basic skills will be improved through compressed, accelerated courses for specific subject modules that will be reinforced with peer tutoring and support systems. The second is the creation of a Freshman Experience class, which will include educating students on career opportunities, basic skills and independent learning. The third focus is developing multiple measures to assess rather than one assessment test. This might involve using high school GPA's and math level after sophomore year of high school.

## Executive Director Report

E. Hill reported on the October 12-13 CASE Conference. The conference focused on fundraising in Community Colleges. Eileen described the diversity amongst community college foundations relating to the sizes of the organizations, the structures and involvement with the colleges and the amount of money being raised. She learned that other campuses have stronger programs targeting employees and retirees, which will be an increased focus for Cabrillo College Foundation. Streamlining database management was also a hot topic at the conference. Eileen reported that the Foundation is a quarter of the way towards its annual fundraising goal. She announced that we will be honoring the Monterey Peninsula Foundation at the December 1, 2017 Holiday Party.

## Executive Director Goals

L. Lapides summarized the 2017-18 Executive Director goals and asked for a motion to approve these goals.

Motion: MSC: R. Spencer/S. Snodgrass. The committee voted unanimously to approve the 2017-18 Executive Director goals.

## Approve Financial Statements

The Executive Committee reviewed the June 30, 2017 Post Audit Financial Statements. Alan Aman that the total assets were $\$ 31.7 \mathrm{M}, \$ 2.2 \mathrm{M}$ over prior year. Net assets were $\$ 29.6 \mathrm{M}$, $\$ 2.2 \mathrm{M}$ over prior year. The total revenue for unrestricted, non-endowed and endowed funds was $\$ 6.1 \mathrm{M}$. Total expenses were $\$ 3.8$ with a net surplus for all funds of $\$ 2.2 \mathrm{M}$. The total operating revenue was $\$ 1.0 \mathrm{M}$ and expenses $\$ 964 \mathrm{~K}$. The operating surplus was $\$ 67,463$ postaudit.

Motion: MSC: L. Jones/R. Spencer. The committee voted unanimously to approve the June 30, 2017 Post-Audit Financial Statements.

The Executive Committee received the July 31, 2017 Post-Audit Financial Statements and reviewed August 31, 2017 Post-Audit Financial Statement. Alan Aman reported as of August 31,2017 , the total assets were $\$ 31.2 \mathrm{M}, \$ 2.1 \mathrm{M}$ over prior year. Net assets were $\$ 30 \mathrm{M}, \$ 2 \mathrm{M}$ over prior year. The total revenue for unrestricted, non-endowed and endowed funds was $\$ 864 \mathrm{~K}$. Total expenses were $\$ 542 \mathrm{~K}$ with a net surplus for all funds of 322 K . The total operating revenue was $\$ 68 \mathrm{~K}$ and expenses $\$ 167 \mathrm{~K}$. The operating deficit was $\$ 98 \mathrm{~K}$.

Motion: MSC: O. Brown/C. Biancalana. The committee voted unanimously to approve the July 31, 2017 - August 31, 2017 Post-Audit Financial Statements.

## Net Assets, Endowed Net Assets and Historical Gifts Chart

The ending net assets balance as of August 31, 2017 was $\$ 29,951,633$. The highest net assets level was $\$ 30,572,308$ as of May 31,2017 . The endowed net assets balance was $\$ 26,625,684$, the highest net assets balance reported. The endowed historical gifts value was $\$ 20,696,721$, the highest reported by the Cabrillo College Foundation.

## Investment Activity review

The Finance Committee approved maintaining the foundation's relationship with Brian Sharpes and moving funds to Morgan Stanley.

## President's Circle

C. Biancalana reported that The President's Circle Kick-off Celebration was held on September $21^{\text {st }}$. $\$ 50,000$ has been raised towards the $\$ 332,000$ goal. She reported that Ted Burke has once again offered hosting a special reception for prospective President Circle members at the Shadowbrook on October $18^{\mathrm{th}}$.

## Women's Educational Success

R. Spencer reported that the WES luncheon was held on Friday, September $15^{\text {th }}$. As of October $9^{\text {th }}, \$ 111,866$ has been received from the annual appeal and donations received through December 31, 2017 will be included in the 2017 WES Campaign. The Wedeen Hammer Group and the Sharanam Foundation collaborated to offer matching grants to donors. $\$ 10,000$ has been matched. This year $\$ 68,000$ will be given out in emergency grants to students in need at Cabrillo through WES.

## Faculty Grants

O. Brown reported that there is $\$ 68,996$ available to award faculty to increase student success, which is up from $\$ 54,000$ awarded last year. In November, a committee of Foundation Board members and Cabrillo faculty will review proposals and select projects to award. A reception will be held in January to celebrate the recipients and to learn about their projects.

Prior to that, he served as Interim Dean of the San Joaquin Delta College Agriculture, Science and Math Division, and before that, was the Dean of Planning, Research and Institutional Effectiveness for five years. He has served as the President of the Research and Planning Group of the California Community Colleges from 2014-2016. His research on the
 effects of the economic recession on California Community College Students has won national and state awards.

Matt began his academic career as a Political Science Instructor, with more than a dozen years of postsecondary teaching experience at colleges and universities in California and Indiana. He received a Ph.D. in Political Science and an M.A. in Political Science from Northern Illinois University, and he holds a B.A. in Political Science from the University of St. Francis, in Joliet, Illinois.

# CABRILLO COLLEGE FOUNDATION <br> November 30, 2017 Condensed Narrative <br> Updated December 19, 2017 

(1) Balance Sheet

- Total Assets:

Total assets of $\$ 32.4 \mathrm{M}$ are $\$ 2.9 \mathrm{M}$ over prior year due to positive investment results, receipt of pledge payments and higher contributed income.

- Receivables:

Total pledges receivable are $\$ 641 \mathrm{~K}$ less than prior year. Pledges receivable will continue to decline until new pledges or bequests are received.

- Liabilities:

Liabilities of $\$ 1.2 \mathrm{M}$ are consistent with prior year with the exception of CaIPERS Deferred Outflows. There is a $\$ 126 \mathrm{~K}$ variance on both the asset and liability side due to the year-end adjustment to move the balances to asset accounts from liability accounts.

- Net Assets:

Total net assets of $\$ 31.2 \mathrm{M}$ are $\$ 3.1 \mathrm{M}$ over prior year.

## (2) Income Statement

- Revenue:

Earned income as of November 30, 2017 of $\$ 1.8 \mathrm{M}$ is $\$ 600 \mathrm{~K}$ over the prior year balance of $\$ 1.2 \mathrm{M}$. Contributed income of $\$ 1.1 \mathrm{M}$ is comparable to last year.

- Surplus/Deficit:

As of November 30, 2017, the Cabrillo College Foundation has a $\$ 1.6 \mathrm{M}$ surplus; $\$ 883 \mathrm{~K}$ higher than prior year.

## (3) Operational Budget to Actual

- Revenue:

Operating revenue of $\$ 330 \mathrm{k}$ is $\$ 5 \mathrm{~K}$ unfavorable vs budget. This is due to the timing of President's Circle donations.

- Expenses:

Operating expenses of $\$ 379,452$ are $\$ 41 \mathrm{~K}$ favorable vs projection. The largest variance is $\$ 11 \mathrm{~K}$ under projection for Consultants expense.

- Surplus/Deficit:

The operating fund deficit is $\$ 49 \mathrm{~K}$. This is $\$ 35 \mathrm{~K}$ better than projected primarily due to $\$ 24 \mathrm{~K}$ in earned income variances.

## (4) Investment Report

The November 30, 2017 investment performance report was not available from Morgan Stanley at the time this packet was e-mailed. Brian Sharpes will provide a report prior to the January 4, 2018 Finance Committee meeting.

SUBJECT: Cabrillo Advancement Program (CAP) Update

## Description

The Cabrillo Advancement Program (CAP) is a scholarship and support program designed to increase the academic success of high risk, low income students and to support their preparation for attending college. CAP includes 350 participants in 12 schools throughout Santa Cruz County. CAP scholars are selected through a competitive process open to students who qualify for free or reduced lunches. Beginning with the first year of middle school and continuing through high school, CAP students receive after-school tutoring and participate in counseling and extracurricular activities that sustain their commitment to preparing for college. Students who complete CAP receive $\$ 2,000$ in scholarships upon high school graduation for their first and second year at Cabrillo.

## Results

CAP has shown amazing success in high school graduation and college-going rates compared to similar population. Last year, 77\% of CAP high school seniors reported going to college-either Cabrillo or directly to a four-year university, exceeding the college enrollment benchmark of $49 \%$ by $36 \%$.

## CAP Funding

In 2016-17 a total of $\$ 67,643$ was raised for CAP. A solicitation will be sent at the beginning of February to help us raise $\$ 16,586$ needed to reach our budget of \$355,989 for CAP.
