New Program Helps Establish Career Pathways For Girls

hirty Santa Cruz County middle school girls stepped into the vast world of engineering for a weeklong Girls in Engineering camp established this year at Cabrillo College through a grant from the Peggy and Jack Baskin Foundation. The Baskins, who are long-time benefactors of the college, provided an \$894,495 donation, which also helped refurbish a campus building,

renamed the Baskin Engineering, Physics, and Computing Center.

"The girls are so excited about the program," says Peggy Downes Baskin, who particularly wanted the program to inspire young girls at such a critical learning age. "It is a way to help light new fires to pursue nontraditional careers."

The five-day summer camp, taught by Rhoxanne Morris with the help of several of Cabrillo's female engineering students, kicked off with a competitive marshmallow launching project. Curriculum emphasized reframing "failure" as a necessary exploration into problem-solving, technical creativity and teamwork.

It was a spectacular program for 11-year-old girls like Ellie Readdie who has been making things since she was three years old, said her mother, Denise Peacock. "I think it's wonderful the girls get exposure to this level of technical excellence at this age."

Carolina Rocha, 11, from Freedom, said she never thought about being an engineer before the camp but now hopes to pursue a mechanical engineering career to create a new type of mechanical pencil.

"It was a real lotus blooming experiment," Morris said, noting that it is aimed at lighting up new career pathways for girls.

Grant Supports New Accelerated Medical Assistant Program

"We know that there's a good chance that we'll see some real success at Cabrillo because they're so willing to innovate, push the envelope and rethink how they're offering education and training,"

abrillo College has reengineered its Medical Assistant Program to address student challenges and employer needs thanks to a \$350,000 Bay Area Workforce Collaborative grant that has jumpstarted the new educational model.

"It's changed everything," says Pam Sanborn, director of the new Accelerated Medical Assistant Program. "The grant meant that the college could make significant and impactful changes in a short amount of time."

The previous model, which had been a success for many years, needed to be redesigned to address increasing competition in the industry and help students integrate basic and professional skills for the workplace. New curriculum includes a stronger emphasis on business and medical chart writing, contextualized math for the office, professionalism, time management, team experience and personal support for problem-solving challenges in the students' own lives.

The program requires a new level of commitment. Students who once were able to sign up for Medical Assistant classes individually are now shepherded through the full-time curriculum as a cohort and complete the program in two years. Graduates will also be prepared to take a national accreditation test.

"It seems like a really good way to get my feet in the medical field," says Jennifer McLean, 24. McLean, the mother of a two-

year old, has just started her second year in the newly redesigned two-year program, and hopes to become a physician's assistant. "I want to make a difference in the world."

The ongoing contribution of local employers who provide critical input about their needs as well as externships and financial contributions have helped boost the program's competitiveness as well. The Palo Alto Medical Foundation, in particular has been a strong ally in the effort to prepare students for the workforce by providing internships, instructional

support and financial gifts to Cabrillo Allied Health programs.

"The funding for the program allowed the Accelerated Medical Assistant program to align with the competency that health care providers in the community desire of our graduates who become their employees," said Kathie Welch, Vice President of Instruction.

"After a slump in hiring, numbers are up this year. Employers felt we were listening to them and were making the changes they needed. It's changed people's lives. The students feel they're part of something."

hen Harvard University graduate Alejandra Beristain-Barajas, 25, looks back at her days in the Cabrillo Advancement Program (CAP), she recalls writing about wanting to be a pediatrician, Saturday academies, summer college prep programs and the ever-present encouragement of CAP coordinator/counselor Liz Dominguez.

Beristain-Barajas, who earned a bachelor's degree in neurobiology in 2010, says CAP helped her stay on track to fulfill her academic dreams. The child of immigrants, she is the first in her family to attend college.

"There was a huge gap in what I knew about college. There were a lot of little steps but if it hadn't started with CAP, just teaching me about the prerequisites, then maybe

in my senior year I would've wanted to go to college but I wouldn't have met those requirements."

As a math teacher at Ceiba College Prep Middle School in Watsonville, Beristain-Barajas tries to share those critical links with her students.

"Everyone can go to college and they're all capable of doing it," she says. "We talk about specifics." She also teaches them about advocating for their own education and dreams.

In its twenty-first year, CAP has shepherded hundreds of students toward graduation. Each year, the program identifies 60 at-risk sixth graders in Santa Cruz County to receive counseling, after-school tutoring, family outreach and support for academic development. Students who graduate from high school are eligible to receive \$2,000 for their first and second years at Cabrillo.

About 350 students in six middle schools and seven high schools were involved in the program this year. Since inception, CAP has awarded 978 scholarships to students attending Cabrillo. Many other students, like Beristain-Barajas, attend four-year colleges or vocational programs.

Philanthropist Barbara Samper, who has supported CAP and other Foundation scholarship programs as the college's largest individual donor, often speaks with CAP students to inspire them to reach for their dreams. She lauds the high number of CAP graduates who have stayed in the area to serve in jobs in their community.

"It thrills me that I can be part of this Cabrillo family," Samper says. "I have received so many letters from CAP students saying, 'I can't believe that someone who doesn't even know me is helping me to go to college and I want to do the same someday.'So, the torch is passed and that is the beauty of the CAP program – so many of them help one another."







tudents from all walks of life are succeeding in their educational pursuits thanks to the generosity of local and regional philanthropists who have set up ongoing scholarship programs for new Cabrillo students.

This year, the Ow Family provided \$500 stipends to 135 local ethnic minority high school seniors enrolling at Cabrillo College. It was the highest number of American Dream Scholarships awarded since the program was founded in 1989. To date, the Ow family has awarded over \$426,000 to 977 graduating high school students coming to Cabrillo. It is just one

These are the kinds of scholarship programs that directly change lives and help make dreams come true.





Eiskamp Family Leaves a Legacy at Cabrillo

n honor of decades of advocacy and service to the community, the Eiskamp family has established the Eiskamp Endowed Scholarship for students from the Watsonville area studying in the Allied Health fields. The legacies of Ehler Eiskamp, a long-time Watsonville surgeon and general practitioner, and his sister, Marguerite Eiskamp Blaisdell, who helped found Cabrillo College, will carry on through a near \$1 million planned gift.

The siblings shared a lifelong interest in education, says John G. Eiskamp, son of Ehler and nephew of Marguerite. His father, Ehler Henry Eiskamp (1897-1999) graduated from Stanford University and "was always interested in young people. He encouraged them to get as much education as possible."

Ehler, who married Agnes, a trained bacteriologist at UC Berkeley, practiced medicine for about 50 years. Ehler participated in the U.S. Navy Medical Corps and

was at Tripler Hospital in Hawaii when the Japanese attacked at Pearl Harbor. In 1945, he returned to his Watsonville practice. He helped fund a new hospital in 1975 and practiced until he was 85 years old, serving as president of the Santa Cruz County Medical Society twice and receiving the California Medical Association Plessner Award, as the most outstanding country doctor in the state. He eventually retired to a large ranch where he raised cattle and hosted lively gatherings.

Marguerite Eiskamp Blaisdell (1899-2001) a Stanford University graduate with a master's degree in chemistry, was a teacher, a wife, mother and community supporter who created a childcare center for working women during WWII. She advocated in school politics, volunteered for Girl Scouts and was a founding Cabrillo College

trustee. She helped establish the community college so young people would not have to leave the county for their vocational education. The Eiskamp family lives on to support students for generations to come.

WES Helps Bridge the Gap For Students



or Jessica Jimenez, 24, living on her own for the first time was going pretty well until her roommate moved out unexpectedly, leaving her with no way to cover rent and the rest of her bills. Instead of dropping out of college to get a new job, her foster care coordinator helped her secure a \$1,000 stipend from the Women's Educational Success (WES)

program so she could persevere in school long enough to get a new roommate.

"I got that check and I felt relieved. I can't say just how much it gave me hope." Jimenez says. The stipend helped with rent, books, gas and food that month. "Everything then, just came together." Jimenez plans to transfer to California State University, Monterey Bay to study social work.

The WES program was launched in 1997 by Peggy Downes Baskin and Rachael

Spencer who recruited donors to establish an endowment. WES provides emergency cash grants to help cover unexpected expenses. The endowment has grown to more than \$1 million and will provide a record \$40,000 this year in grants.

"There is no other program like it," says Michele Bassi, who is serving as co-chair of the WES Committee with Marilyn Cal-

"Years ago, Rachael Spencer and I shared a dream," Downes Baskin says. "We both believed that the most meaningful way we could support women in need was to enable them to go back to school with a sense of purpose and hope. WES has helped hundreds of women become successful, independent women. It's one of the most satisfying things I've ever been involved with."

Calciano agrees. WES, she says, allows women to stay in school and really change their world. "In the scheme of things it's not that much money but it can change someone's life."

Foundation Support for Faculty and Staff


he creativity and innovation of Cabrillo College instructors and staff is wonderfully enhanced by three faculty and staff grant programs that provide funding each year for specific classrooms and projects. Last year, Faculty Grants for Student Success, Crocker Endowment Grants, and the Engineering and Applied Science Endowment awarded a total of \$45,836. Especially in times of tightened budgets, new equipment and resources make a huge difference in the student experience. Grants range in size from about \$600 to more than \$5,000. This year, over \$50,000 will be awarded to faculty and staff.

"Neuro-cognitive testing for brains gives us more objective information when trying to manage concussions. Having this kind of data makes me feel very comfortable when we allow athletes to go back on the field. It's one tool that's objective."

r. J. Laurel Jones has served as President Superintendent of Cabrillo College since July 2013 and has a 30-year career serving California community colleges. Previously, she served as president of Mission College in Santa Clara for 3 years. She began her academic career at Mount San Antonio College in Walnut as an English instructor, one of the early basic skills teachers in developmental education. She later served as dean of instruction at Mount San Jacinto College in Riverside County, then as vice president of Academic Affairs at Solano Community College and as vice president of Academic Services at Las Positas College in Livermore.

A dynamic advocate of college and community partnerships, she helped establish the Mission College Center for Technology and Innovation, worked closely with workforce development organizations and participated in the 2012 White House Summit on Entrepreneurship while at Mission College.

Dr. Jones earned a bachelor's degree in English from Taylor University in Indiana, a master's degree in English from California State University, Fullerton and a doctorate in Educational Leadership from the University of La Verne.

We had the opportunity to meet up with our new president, Dr. J. Laurel Jones, this summer, just a month after she started her job. Below are some of the highlights of our talk.

Getting to Know Cabrillo President Dr. J. Laurel Jones

Q: What can you tell us about your family?

A: My family is my rock. One of the things about my family is our ability to talk about anything. They are my best supporters and my kindest critics. I met my husband Richard when we were 14 years old at Emerson Junior High School in Pomona and we've been together ever since. He is a production control manager at Lockheed Martin and a volunteer for Habitat for Humanity. We have two adult children and two grandchildren.

Q: You are a former marathon runner. Is there anything similar between running a marathon and leading a community college?

A: Every marathoner does a marathon differently. I would remind myself that pacing is the wisdom of marathon running. I try to do that in my leadership now. I'm not always successful, but I try. Also, it's important to enjoy the journey and not focus on the end, otherwise you'll be running a long time for nothing. You need to enjoy the scenery along the way. Part of what I appreciate about my job is the people I get to work with. I think it's the same in marathon running. You enjoy the scenery along the way.

Q: Over the years, you have talked much about community partnership and the need to meet the 21st century as a community steward. What does it mean to be a community steward?

A: Community stewardship in terms of education is an institution that learns along with its city. One of the unique things about Cabrillo is that because of the fantastic relationship it has with its community, we are trying to go to the next level and do some strategic planning, to look to the future of the college and of the county and see how we can be stewards there. Many of our challenges actually have regional solutions. I think a community steward wants to look at regional possibilities and solutions.

Q: While at Mission College, you supported entrepreneurship training and even got to participate in the 2012 White House Summit on Entrepreneurship. What was the most interesting thing about that trip? Is there anything you want to say about the role of community college and entrepreneurship?

A: We were the only community college represented at the White House. Everybody else was from a four-year university. I believe whole-heartedly that we have stellar staff, instructors and students who can be just as instrumental at bringing entrepreneurial options to the community as four-year universities. I was part of a group that demonstrated that very well. We created a nonprofit at the college that provided internship opportunities for students in the community.

Q: What do you think is the role of the Foundation in these economic times?










Total Net Assets & Endowment Growth 1990-2013

Monterey Peninsula Foundation Grant Revitalizes STEM Program

New STEM Center Supports Collaborative, Interdisciplinary Study



he new Monterey Peninsula Foundation STEM Center, a central feature of the revamped vision for Cabrillo College's Science, Technology, Engineering and Math study has been buzzing with activity since opening this fall to the new age of multi-discipline education at Cabrillo College.

"To have this center means we can stay connected with each other," said Sarah Kalman, 24, a second year engineering student. "It gives us more chances for success."

The Monterey Peninsula Foundation, a philanthropic foundation with roots dating back to Bing Crosby's golf tournament fundraisers in the 1930s, has been a generous supporter of Cabrillo College. This last year, the Foundation donated \$250,000 for renovations of the Peggy and Jack Baskin Center for Engineering, Physics and Computing, in addition to \$50,000 through its Youth Fund for six impactful projects. The gift brings the organization's total gifts to the Cabrillo Foundation to \$307,500.

"We look at the areas of greatest need in the communities we serve," said Steve John, chief executive officer of the Monterey Peninsula Foundation.

The renovated building addresses Cabrillo College's previously inadequate facilities for the engineering, physics and computer science programs by central-

izing programs, which also allows the program to increase its enrollment. The 5,000-square-foot STEM Center is a wonderfully improved learning environment.

"This was an easy grant to give because Cabrillo's done so much for the community and the community believes in what they're doing," John said. "We see that they have so much skin in the game. Cabrillo College is a true community college." The Monterey Peninsula Foundation's Youth Fund also provided support to numerous ongoing initiatives at Cabrillo to encourage college success, including: Cabrillo Advancement Program (CAP) Tutoring Support (\$10,000); Cabrillo Commitment S4C Scholarships (\$10,000); Cabrillo Youth Chorus Program Support (\$10,000); Cabrillo Tutorials Program Support (\$10,000); Cabrillo Athletics Equipment (\$8,350); Cabrillo Youth Summer Institute Scholarships (\$1,650).
