Call to Order – W. Ow called the meeting to order at 9:03 am

Approval of Agenda

Motion: MSC: L. Burroughs/ C. Biancalana. The committee voted unanimously to approve the Executive Committee agenda.

Approve Executive Committee Minutes

Motion: MSC: L. Burroughs/ O. Brown. Claire Biancalana, Owen Brown, Linda Burroughs, Leola Lapides, William Ow and Matt Wetstein voted to approve the Executive Committee Minutes of January 17, 2019.

Public Comment Opportunity

There were no members of the public in attendance.

Cabrillo College President Report

Matt Wetstein gave an update on the new Stadium Turf project. The project is on time and the new turf will be done by graduation.

Matt also reported that a grant was received from The Santa Cruz County Homeless Emergency Assistance Program (HEAP) to help Cabrillo students with rental assistance. \$137,000 in emergency funds are available to help students facing housing insecurity. Matt reported that Landed, a company that offers financial assistance for K-12 teachers and staff to buy homes in the communities they serve, is offering assistance to Cabrillo teachers and staff. Landed will give a match of \$120,000 for down payment to Cabrillo employees. There is no interest on the funds. Landed makes its return on investment when the house is sold or bought out. They buyer shares 25% of the investment gain or loss with Landed.

Matt reported that Victoria Lewis will be retiring on May 2, 2019 from her role as VP Administrative Services. Steve Crow from Monterey Peninsula College will act as interim VP until the position is filled.

Executive Director Report

Eileen Hill reported on the Cabrillo College Foundation's scholarship administration. An estimated1000 students will be receiving scholarships for the next year.

The Foundation has made some changes to staff. One part time staff member had to be let go and one has gone out on maternity leave. Duties are being dispersed amongst the remaining staff members, part time staff are pitching in more hours, and recruitment and hiring of a new part time staff will begin soon.

Eileen reported that the Foundation has raised \$2,923,203 towards its \$3M goal and \$1,405,000 has been added in unbooked planned gifts.

Eileen described the Dental Hygiene Side by Side project which allows Cabrillo Dental Hygiene student to provide dental care to Stroke Center students. The Foundation received \$25,000 for this program and an additional \$25,000 is pending.

She reported that the Ag Tech Summit and Ag Tech Grand Opening were huge successes launching Cabrillo's new degree in Ag Tech.

The High Achievers Scholarship Ceremony was held on April 9 and was a great event. All 10 recipients of this Grove Foundation scholarship were in attendance and gave heart-warming speeches about how this generous scholarship is changing their lives.

Approve Financial Statements

The Executive Committee received the February 28, 2019 Financial Statements. Owen Brown reported as of February 28, 2019, the total assets of \$35.3M are \$953K over prior year. Net assets were \$34M, \$726K over prior year. The total revenue for unrestricted, nonendowed and endowed funds was \$3M. Total expenses were \$1.8M with a net surplus for all funds of \$1.2M. The total operating revenue was \$747K and expenses \$585K. The operating surplus was \$162K.

Approve 2019-20 Operating Budget

Fundraising Goal

E.Hill reported that the Foundation has a fundraising goal of \$3M for outright and unbooked planned gifts for 2019-20.

Community Capital Management

Eileen Hill reported that Brian Sharpes recommended moving a portion of the Foundation's fixed asset investment portfolio to invest in a CRA Qualified Investment Fund (CRANX) with Community Capital Management. The fund allows investors to target specific counties thereby allowing the Foundation to invest in our local community. All Finance and Investment Committee members indicated their support for this investment.

President's Circle

Claire Biancalana reported that the President's Circle Committee has surpassed its goal of \$380,000, having raised a total of \$380,697 to date! There are 20 NEW members and 13 rejoining members increased their support this year. Duf and Paul Fischer will join Michele Bassi as co-chairs of the 2019-2020 campaign. We had another exciting adventure with Sandy Lydon in early April. We ventured to Hollister, Sandy's hometown, and the Foundation has received many nice notes of thanks from the guests who attended.

Scholarships

Claire Biancalana reported that we are very fortunate to have such a robust scholarship program at Cabrillo with approximately 400 scholarship opportunities available to students each year. Last fiscal year we awarded over \$1 million in scholarships to 1031 students We are now in the midst of the scholarship recipient selection process and awards will be finalized soon. The Financial Aid office will notify all scholarship recipients in mid-May and the funds will be disbursed at the beginning of the fall semester.

Committee members include: Claire Biancalana, Rachael Spencer (chair), Jess Brown, Ceil Cirillo, Virginia Coe, Linda Downing, Jan Furman, Rich Hart, Adele Miller, Corinne Miller, Julie Thiebaut, Rachel Wedeen and Jill Wilson. The next committee meeting will be held sometime in August and the focus of the meeting will be this year's Scholarship Donor Reception, which will be held on October 24th.

<u>WES</u>

Leola Lapides reported that for the 2019-20 academic year, \$80,000 will be awarded in WES grants to students in need, which is the most ever awarded! These funds will become available on July 1st, when we begin our new fiscal year. WES funds for the 2018-19 academic year have been spent. WES issued grants totaling \$75,000 to students over the last year. Rhonda Bonett and Lindy Bixby are our co-chairs for the 2019 WES Campaign and they have been busy helping to solicit luncheon sponsorships for the event this year. WES has raised \$21,000 towards the goal of \$24,000. There are 30 WES Committee members this year. The following have recently joined: Lynette Cleland, Corrine Flanagan, Sue Nerton, Carilyn Parham and Kristin Wilson. The WES luncheon will be held on Friday, September 20 at the Horticulture Center.

Board of Trustees Report, August 5, 2019

June and July flew by in a whirl. Right after the June board meeting I went on vacation for 2.5 weeks. Cindy and I did a great tour of Portugal and Spain, including visits to Lisbon, Salema, Seville, Granada, Valencia, Mallorca, and the Costa Brava. We came back rested, relaxed and recharged...and with a great appreciation or the seafood of Spain and Portugal.

HIGHLIGHTS OF RECENT VISITS/TOURS

A couple of highlights from July included a visit to Common Roots Farm with Trustee Rachael Spencer, and a visit with new UCSC Chancellor Dr. Cindy Larive. The Common Roots Farm features a Cabrillo Ag-Tech program graduate, Natalie Markovics, who is helping them establish a hydroponics program in their greenhouse (see the photo on the left). Natalie is a true Cabrillo success story. Dr. Larive spent time touring the Cabrillo campus with me and met with some of the administrators and program directors. SCFF FUNDING ANALYSIS & ADVOCACY

Analysis of the SCFF data for various districts throughout the state shows that at Second Period Apportionment for 2018-19 (P2), the number of districts in Hold Harmless status (COLA funding only) grew to 26 (up from just over a dozen in June of 2018). A handful of these districts are so-called "basic aid" districts that are not really impacted by the SCFF because of their large property tax revenues. Even so, a surprising number of districts are now Hold Harmless or very near the Hold Harmless threshold of SCFF calculations. Included among the "close to the COLA edge" districts are Lake Tahoe and San Diego (0.2 and 0.9 percent above the Hold Harmless COLA respectively). Depending on spring 2018 success data, they are very likely to become HH COLA districts in the coming budget cycle.

On the advocacy front, I appreciate the internal support for the proposed 5% SCFF Improvement Fund. I know that many Cabrillo individuals wrote to the Chancellor's Office advocating for the proposal. I also know that at least one CEO system-wide offered their support.

Subject:	2018-19 Fundraising Targets

The Board approved a \$3M fundraising goal in outright and unbooked planned gifts with a stretch goal of \$3.2M. The following is an outline of the specific fundraising targets for the year to reach \$3M. The \$3M goal includes a target of \$760,000 in endowed gifts and \$500,000 in unbooked planned gifts. Focusing some effort on legacy giving will help ensure the long-term health and sustainability of the Foundation.

Total fundraising for 2018-19 was \$5,093,791 raised in outright and unbooked planned gifts from 2,509 donors. We exceeded the \$760,000 target for endowed gifts with \$1,308,142 raised for the endowment.

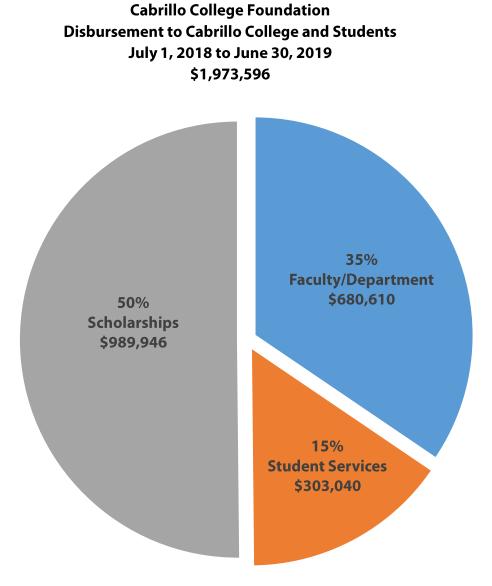

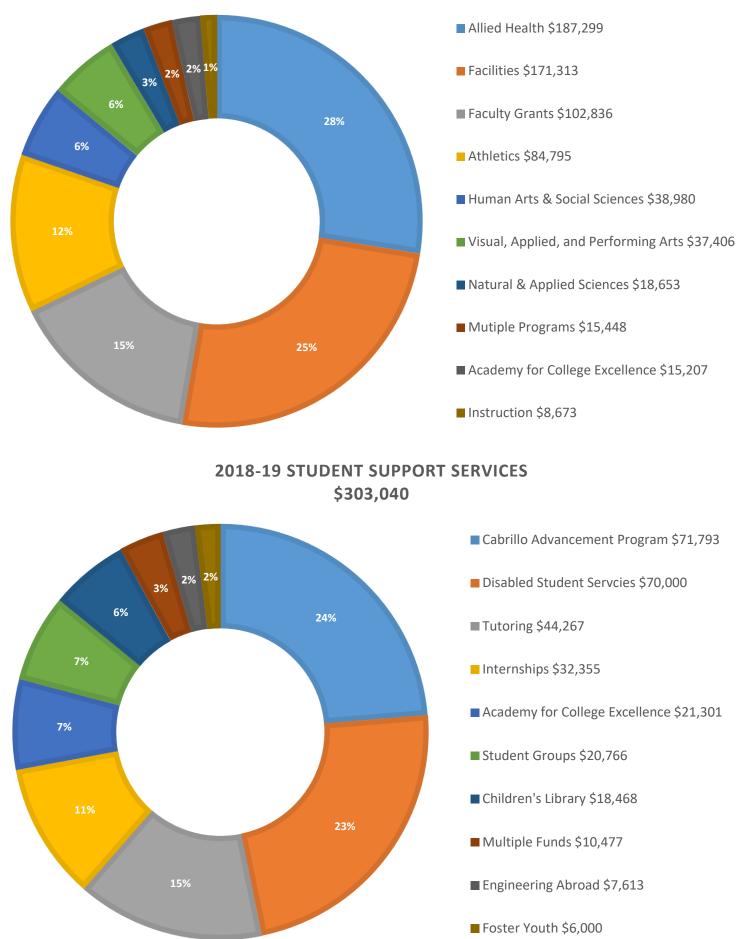

(1) Balance Sheet

• Total Assets:

Total assets of \$36.5M are \$1.7M over prior year due to increased cash and investment balances.

• Receivables:

Total pledges receivable are \$81K more than prior year. This is the net pledge activity between receiving a \$300,000 pledge (award is \$100,000 per year for three years) to First Generation College Student Scholarships and collecting pledge payments from pledges made in prior years.

• Liabilities:

Total Liabilities of \$2.6M are \$568K over prior year. There was \$187K more in scholarships awarded, \$195K in additional CAP scholarships and \$172K higher in outstanding accounts payable to Cabrillo College.

• Net Assets:

Total net assets of \$34M are \$1.1M over prior year.

(2) Income Statement

• Revenue:

Earned income as of June 30, 2019 is \$1.5M compared to the prior year balance of \$2.7M due to lower investment income earned. Contributed income of \$3.7M is \$606K lower than prior year contributions. Last year, we received the \$1.2M bequest from the estate of Evelyn Pelz.

• Expenses:

Total Expenses of \$4.1M are \$367K over prior year. Salary expense was lower as well and payroll taxes and benefits were lower due to two job vacancies for part of the year. Program expenses were \$165K higher than prior year and Scholarships \$310K higher than prior year.

• Surplus/Deficit:

As of June 30, 2019, the Cabrillo College Foundation has a \$1.1M surplus compared to prior year surplus of \$3.3M.

(3) Operational Budget to Actual

• Revenue:

Operating revenue of \$1.2M is \$144K favorable vs budget. Earned income was \$93K favorable due to larger than projected interest and dividend income and endowment management fees. Contributed income was \$51K favorable. Both President's Circle and Annual fund exceeded their goals for 2018-19.

• Expenses:

Operating expenses of \$905K are \$61K favorable vs projection primarily due to lower salaries and payroll taxes and benefits due to vacancies in two positions during the year.

• Surplus/Deficit:

The operating fund surplus is \$249,689 prior to audit. This number will be updated when the annual adjustments for the CalPERS liability and the Retiree Medical Insurance liability are calculated during 4the course of the audit. Any surplus will be allocated to the Operating Reserve account to fulfill the goal of having 6 months of operating reserve. We have \$344,015 in reserve pre-audit as of June 30, 2019. This is 70% of our 19-20 operating reserve goal of \$489,805.

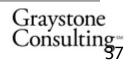
Cabrillo College Foundation ESG Long-Term Pool Summary As of June 30, 2019



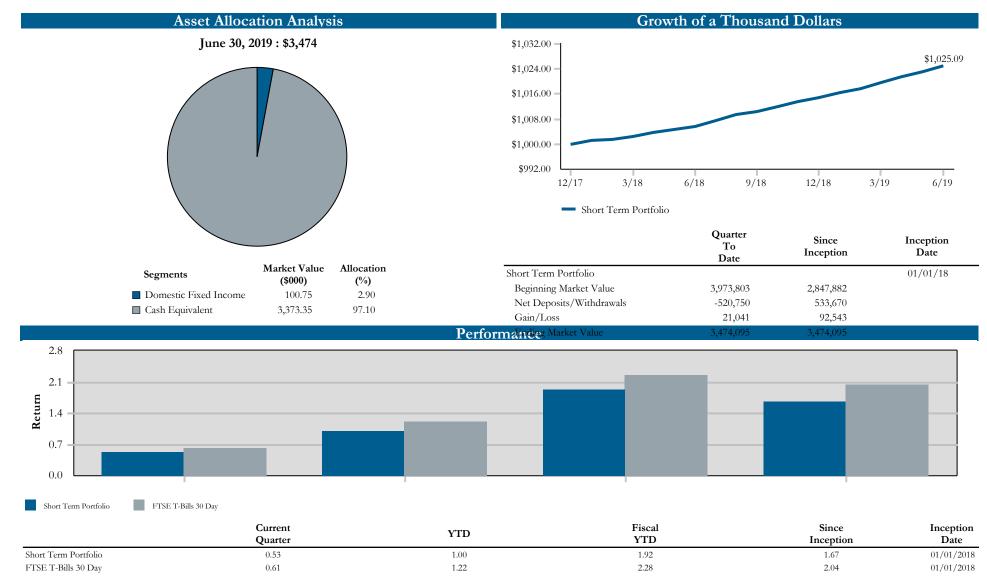


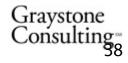
Cabrillo College Foundation Intermediate-Term Pool Summary As of June 30, 2019



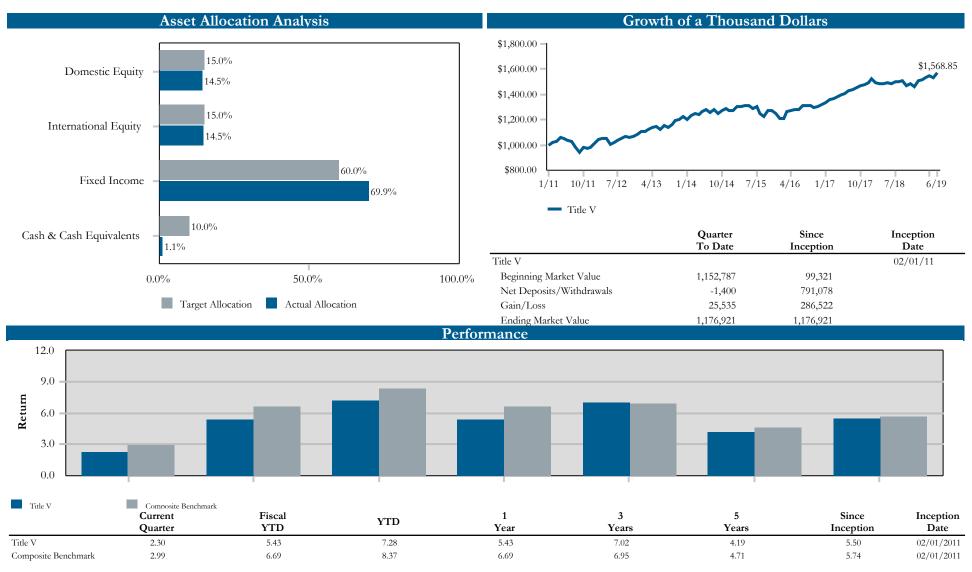


Cabrillo College Foundation Short Term Portfolio Summary As of June 30, 2019



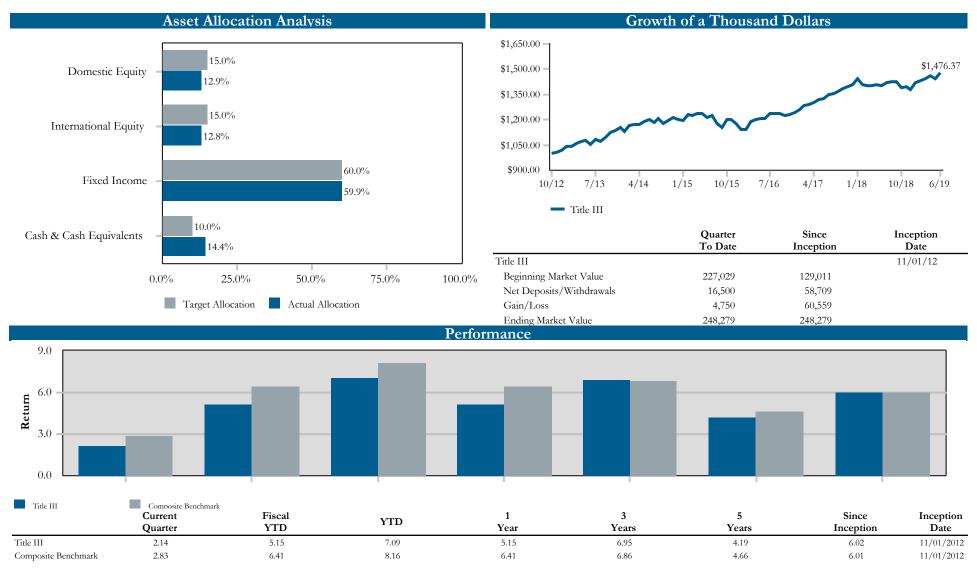


Cabrillo College Foundation Title V Portfolio Summary As of June 30, 2019



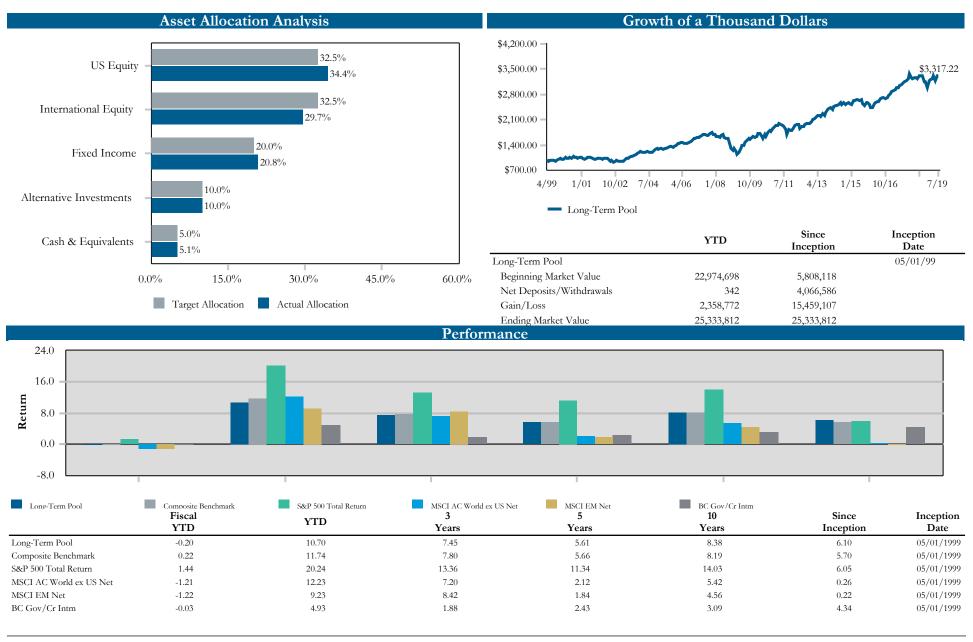


Cabrillo College Foundation Title III Portfolio Summary As of June 30, 2019



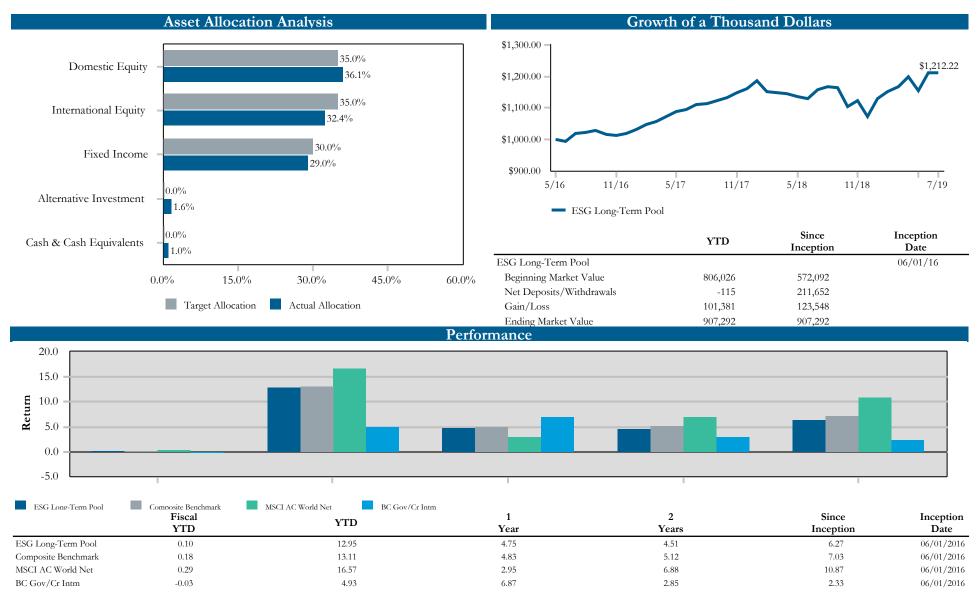


Cabrillo College Foundation Long-Term Pool Summary As of July 31, 2019



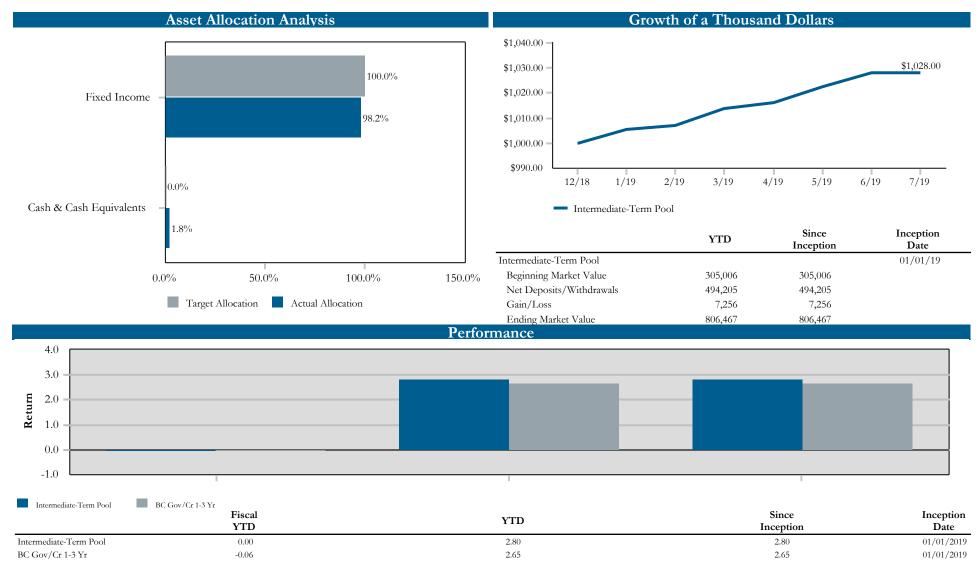

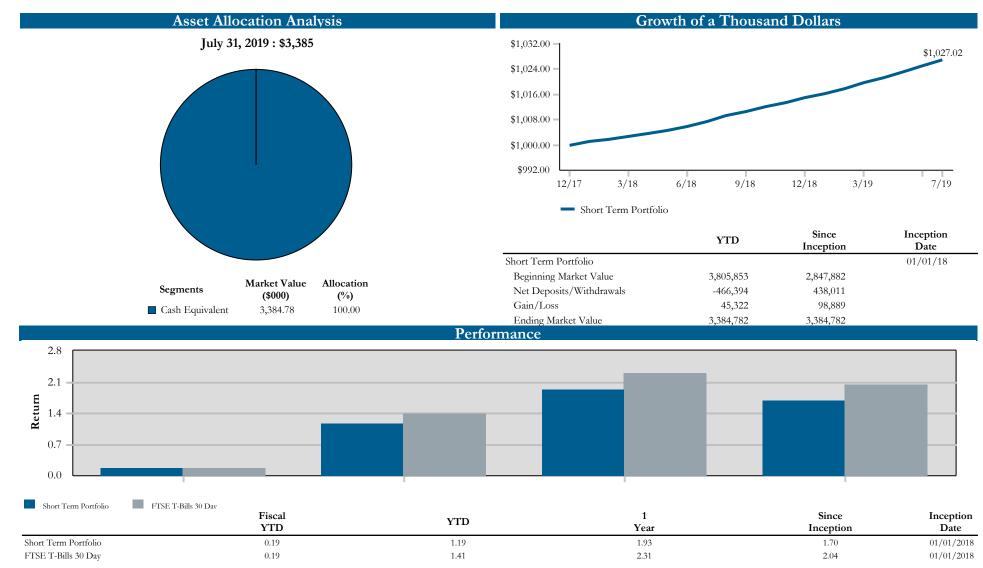


Cabrillo College Foundation Intermediate-Term Pool Summary As of July 31, 2019



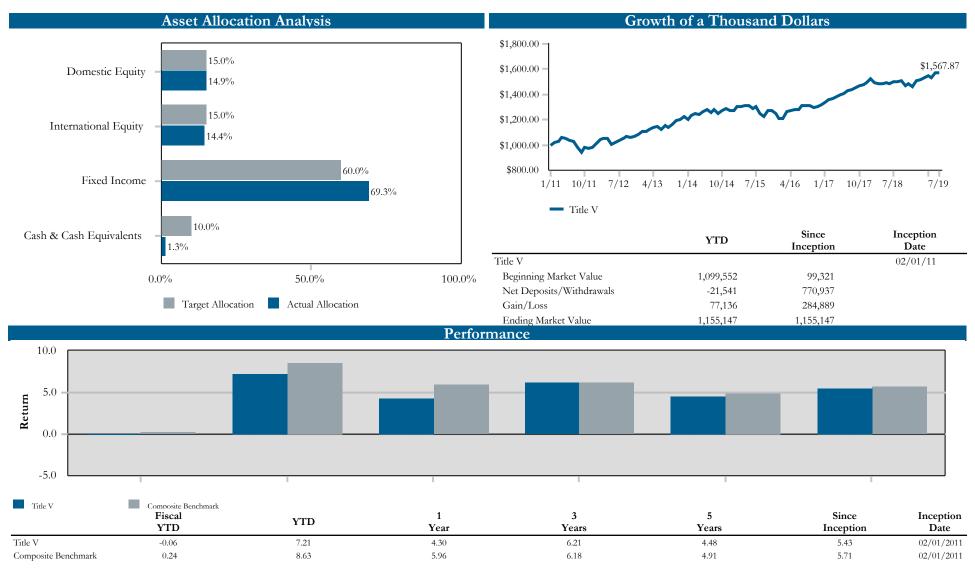


Cabrillo College Foundation Short Term Portfolio Summary As of July 31, 2019



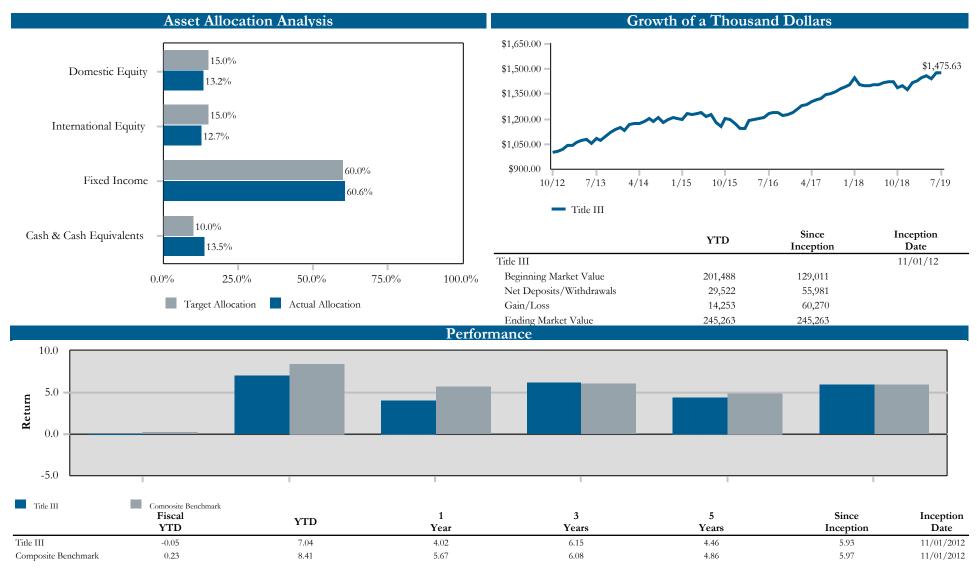

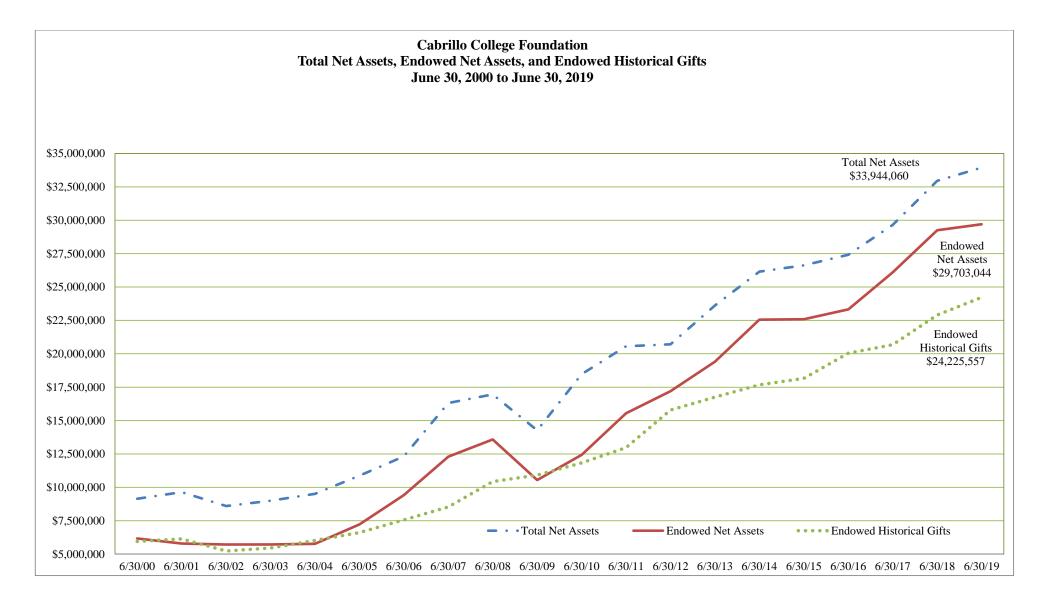

"I am at Cabrillo pursuing the nursing program. I am currently an EMT and ultimately want to be a critical care and flight trauma nurse. I have my eyes set on working in extreme healthcare.

This semester, I was in distress, because my car needed an expensive repair. I was living in the hills with no bus stop nearby. I was afraid I was going to have to drop out of school. I went to Financial Aid to see about getting a loan, but the kind staff told me about the WES program and arranged for me to get a \$1,000 grant! I received the money in two days. What I want you to know, is that this help moves me deeply. You probably don't know what a positive impact your generosity has to students like myself. This grant removed so much stress and helped me focus on my education." --Danielle

Dahlia is a student in the Medical Assisting program with a 4.0 GPA. She hit a crisis in her relationship, and faculty connected her to helpful resources to ensure her well-being and that of her son. They arranged for her to receive a WES grant of \$500, which she received the next day!

"I made the decision to go back to school and it has completely changed my life. I'm really grateful for the support! I got a boost and I'm at the point now where I can work on myself and not be stuck. I'm proceeding to make difference in myself and out in the world and that's what I want to do." --Dahlia



Jamie received a grant to help with needed car repair. Jamie Pyle is a single mom with an ambitious dream of starting a non-profit someday. Working on her business degree, caring for her sick mother and getting her children to school was already daunting, but when her car needed new tires, she wasn't sure how to proceed. She was awarded an emergency WES grant of \$750 that helped her stay on the road and in school.

"I was really in a predicament. I never got my high school diploma, so I was not eligible for Financial Aid. I want to thank everyone who has made it possible for this program to be available to us women at Cabrillo." --Jamie
