## Cabrillo College Foundation Executive Committee Meeting Minutes January 23, 2020

Call to Order - O. Brown called the meeting to order at 9:02 am

#### Approval of Agenda

**Motion: MSC: R. Spencer/ L. Burroughs.** The committee voted unanimously to approve the Executive Committee agenda.

### **Public Comment Opportunity**

There were no members of the public in attendance.

#### **Approve Executive Committee Minutes**

**Motion: MSC: W. Ow/ R. Spencer.** Pegi Ard, Owen Brown, David Heald, William Ow, Gun Ruder and Rachael Spencer voted to approve the Executive Committee Minutes of October 24, 2019. Claire Biancalana, Linda Burroughs and Matt Wetstein abstained.

#### Cabrillo College President Report

Matt Westein gave a brief summary of college projects he has been working on. Bond work is ongoing and fundraising is going well. The governor's budget proposal does not include improvements to the funding formula so he is working on trying to affect change to the formula before Senator Monning leaves office. Matt reported that enrollment at the college is down and this is largely due to a good economy in which more students are working part time instead of taking classes. As the economy slows, enrollment will rise. Matt announced that Cabrillo was awarded a \$3M, five-year Department of Education grant, which proposes a partnership with CSU Monterey Bay in creating more seamless pathways between the two institutions. The focus of the grant is to serve first generation Watsonville students in targeted disciplines: psychology, business/accounting, kinesiology, biology and computer science. Cabrillo was 1 of 40 colleges/universities nationwide that were awarded this grant. Matt informed the committee that Roberta Bristol, founding faculty member at Cabrillo College, passed away earlier in the week. Matt had the opportunity to meet Roberta at the Cabrillo College 60th Anniversary event.

#### **Executive Director Report**

Eileen reported that she has been learning more about IRA's and how to make it easier for donors to give through their IRA accounts. She reported that the Annual Fund phone campaign is starting in March. The campaign has been scaled down but still generates approximately \$60K in gifts and keeps a connection with donors who expect the calls. A recent \$10,000 estate gift to WES was received from an Annual Fund donor who had historically been giving \$25 per year for 10 years.

Eileen informed the group that \$1,537,308 in outright gifts and \$1,120,000 in unbooked planned gifts has been raised towards the 2019-20 goal of \$3M. President's Circle has exceeded it's \$380K goal. Eileen reported that she continues to work with new legacy giving donors. A new \$20,000 scholarship has been established and she is working with another potential scholarship donor.

Eileen gave a graphical representation of the Foundation's disbursements to Cabrillo College and students from July 1, 2019 to December 31, 2019 totaling \$1.6M, \$1,019,392 in scholarships to students.

#### Foundation Contribution to Measure R

Eileen Hill reported that The Friends of Cabrillo College, Yes on Measure R Committee is raising \$350,000 to fund the campaign to pass Measure R. She explained that according to the Fair Political Practice Commission (FPPC) the Cabrillo College Foundation is legally able to contribute up to \$49,999 to Measure R without being listed as Major Donor on all bond campaign materials. Furthermore, per FPPC rules, the foundation is legally able to provide funding to Measure R by using non donor funds. The proposed contribution of \$49,999 is within legal limits and provides significant support to the campaign

**Motion: MSC: L. Burroughs/ W. Ow.** The committee voted to approve and recommend to the Board of Directors a donation in the amount of \$49,999 from the Cabrillo College Foundation from operational reserves, comprised of non donor funds, and within the IRS 501(h) election limits, to support Measure R. Matt Wetstein abstained.

#### **Employee Paid Time Off Policy Revision**

Eileen Hill explained the Foundation's current PTO accrual policy which allows PTO eligible employees to accrue a maximum of two years of PTO. Upon reaching the maximum, employees cease to accrue PTO until they have reduced their PTO hours by a minimum of 8 hours. Accrual will then resume until the maximum level has been once again reached. The Cabrillo College Foundation would like to follow Cabrillo College District policy and allow employees who have reached their maximum PTO level to cash out up to 80 hours between July 1st and June 30th annually, provided they retain a minimum balance of 80 hours of PTO. It was discussed that as manager, Eileen should find ways to encourage employees to take time off and make a plan for employees who are near their max.

**Motion: MSC: G. Ruder/ R. Spencer.** The committee voted unanimously to approve and recommend to the Board of Directors to update the PTO accrual policy to allow employees who have reached their maximum PTO level to cash out up to 80 hours per year, provided a minimum balance of 80 hours of PTO is retained.

#### **Approve Financial Statements**

The Executive Committee reviewed the November 30, 2019 Financial Statements. Pegi Ard reported as of November 30, 2019, the total assets were \$38M, \$4M over prior year. Net assets were \$36.5M, \$3.6M over prior year. The total revenue for unrestricted, non-endowed and endowed funds was \$2.1M. Total expenses were \$968K with a net surplus for all funds of \$1.2M. The total operating revenue was \$393K and expenses \$362K. The operating surplus was \$31K.

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**Motion: MSC: D. Heald/ G. Ruder.** The committee voted unanimously to approve the November 30, 2019 Financial Statements.

#### Net Assets, Endowed Net Assets and Historical Gifts Chart

The ending net assets balance as of November 30, 2019 was \$36,456,241. The endowed net assets balance was \$32,190,007. The endowed historical gifts value was \$26,122,237.

#### President's Circle

Claire Biancalana reported that the committee has surpassed the goal of \$380,000 and has raised \$395,284.50. There are 25 NEW members and 13 rejoining members increased their support this year. A renewal reminder will go out to all current President Circle members who have yet to respond to the invitation mailing and even more gifts will come in after the reminder is sent.

#### Cabrillo Advancement Program (CAP)

Eileen Hill reported that in 2018-19 a total of \$1,812,868 was raised for CAP. A solicitation will be sent at the beginning of February to help us continue to grow the CAP Endowment for permanent and sustainable funding. The CAP ceremony will be held on March 24 at the Crocker Theater. This year a former CAP student, Lucy Sanchez will be one of the speakers. Lucy is a great CAP success story. After graduating from Cabrillo, she earned a four-year degree at UC Berkeley then a masters degree from CSUMB in Public Policy. She now works for the County of Monterey.

#### **Scholarships**

Rachael Spencer reported that the Scholarship Donor Reception was held in October and we received nearly \$35,000 as a result of the event, including several new scholarship endowments that were established. The annual year-end scholarship solicitation letters went out in December and we've received \$123,061 in scholarship support from this solicitation. Our scholarship committee members added personal notes to many of these letters again this year and it makes such an impact.

#### **Faculty Grants**

Owen Brown reported that we have awarded \$107,787 to Cabrillo staff and faculty for over 30 different projects this year, which is the most we've ever awarded. One project that our committee was very excited to fund was the Asteroid Occultation Timing Equipment that will allow astronomy students to track asteroids! Another wonderful project that received funding is a ceramic mural created by Engineering and Art students. The images on the mural will depict how engineering stems from math and science and will serve as a wonderful STEAM collaboration for students.

#### **Measure R Results**

The final vote tallies for the election have been certified. Despite a great campaign effort, and our ability to convince nearly 3,000 more voters to support Cabrillo than in 2016, our campaign fell short. We ended up receiving 53% of the vote. We needed 55%.

Measure R suffered the same fate as the majority of others across the state. Outside of a few wealthy enclaves, nearly every community college ballot measure went down to defeat. This pattern played out in both Democratic and Republican strongholds. It happened to colleges in Riverside, Merced, Sacramento and Orange County, to name a few.

Some contributing factors that led to a wave of bond measure losses include:

- Proposition 13, the statewide measure to fund facilities at public schools including community colleges, being on the ballot, which produced voter roll-off on many local community college ballot measures. Having voted for Prop 13 (that also failed), voters tended to say no or skip voting at higher levels when facing the local bond measures.
- Locally, voters appeared to vote for city and K-12 measures first and show less support for Cabrillo. For example, the safety tax in Watsonville was seen as more significant than a bond measure for the college.
- Measure R also suffered from depressed turnout in the waning days of the election as the Democratic Party race solidified to two candidates, COVID-19 unease set in and the stock market experienced a crash, leaving some tax payers uncertain.
- The anti-tax trend of recent years gained momentum. The rejection of Proposition 13
  represented the first time in more than 20 years that a statewide education bond was rejected
  by voters.

Despite the outcome, all of us involved in the campaign are proud of our efforts. Surveying races across the California landscape, we are one of the districts that came closest to victory. That stems from a great team, led by Elaine Johnson our campaign manager, and the efforts of many who supported us. We will always be grateful.

#### **COVID-19 Changes our Education Landscape**

Just after the election, Cabrillo began grappling with the long-term implications of the COVID-19 virus. Following local and state public health guidelines, on March 12 the College made the decision to shut down effective March 16, moving virtually every class to online instruction just a week ahead of spring break. In compliance with state and county shelter-in-place orders, we have moved all services and operations previously offered in person to online. All employees are now working remotely, except for those deemed essential, on-campus employees. Graduation is being planned as a virtual graduation experience online. Summer session will be fully online to help defeat the spread of the virus.

Students and staff have rallied well in response to this new normal. Our nursing program was a leader in the state by shifting student clinical work to tele-health programming that protects the health of senior citizens in our community. Our Makerspace Program is designing and producing personal protective equipment for local medical professionals using a fleet of 3-D printers.

Through the graciousness of foundation donors and the shifting of grant funds, Cabrillo is stepping up to assist students. More than 650 Chromebook computers are being distributed to students in need so they can continue their learning. The Cabrillo Foundation is providing \$500 emergency grants to students living paycheck to paycheck who are seeing their part-time jobs evaporate amidst a shelter-in-place life. Even so, the College, our students, and the entire country, are entering a phase of economic downturn that will alter our landscape for months, if not years.

Cabrillo will make it through this period. With 60 years of success under our belts, we will not allow Measure R's defeat or the COVID-19 virus to define us. Instead, the College will weather through tough times, relying on our exceptional leadership team, innovative and pragmatic faculty and staff, our resilient students, and the community spirit that makes this region so special.

#### **Grants & Funding**

The College is actively pursuing grant funding that is being released in response to the COVID-19 virus outbreak. Two important applications are currently underway. One would pursue the purchase of emergency notification equipment that ensures inter-operability with county agencies. Our IT staff are collaborating with Sheriff's Office staff to ensure we purchase the right technology for emergency broadcasting though our network of phones and on-campus stations. A second application underway is for California OES and FEMA reimbursement for expenses related to our spending to address COVID-19 impacts. Both are due within the next week.

#### **Fun in Zoomland**

Finally, I want to highlight a couple of fun moments I recently had in Zoom as we move to a new state of normal in education. One was Skye Gentile's strange dinosaur hat that cracked me up in the middle of a Faculty Senate meeting. A second one occurred in the Student government meeting last week — again with funky hats coming out of nowhere. It gave me a chance to put on my Makerspace Face shield. Both instances gave everyone a light-hearted moment in the midst of strange days, and it is refreshing to be able to see faces under our shelter in place guidelines. Finally, I attended my first-ever zoom happy hour with a group of PRO employees...no drinks were consumed before 5 pm Pacific time.

#### (1) Balance Sheet

#### Total Assets:

Total assets of \$37.2M are \$1.9M over prior year.

#### • Receivables:

Total pledges receivable are \$928K more than prior year.

#### • Liabilities:

Total Liabilities of \$1.6M are \$300K over prior year. This is due to the increase in the amount of each CAP scholarship for all students in CAP and adding 10 more students from CAP Branciforte Middle School.

#### Net Assets:

Total net assets of \$35.6M are \$1.6M over prior year.

#### (2) Income Statement

#### • Revenue:

Earned income as of February 29, 2020 is \$63K compared to the prior year balance of \$266K due primarily to investment performance. Contributed income of \$2.3M is \$691K less than prior year.

#### • Expenses:

Total Expenses of \$2M are \$166K more than prior year due to increases in program expenses and scholarships.

#### • Surplus/Deficit:

As of February 29, 2020, the Cabrillo College Foundation has a \$315K surplus compared to prior year surplus of \$1.2M.

#### (3) Operational Budget to Actual

#### • Revenue:

Operating revenue of \$793K is \$104K favorable vs budget. The President's Circle donations are ahead of plan by \$65K and unrestricted income is \$29K favorable due to a \$32K unrestricted bequest.

#### **OVERVIEW**

The proposed 2020-21 Operating Budget revenue is \$961,868 and expenses are \$1,019,989, resulting in a projected \$58,121 deficit. There is \$489,804 in the Reserve and \$132,878 projected 2019-20 surplus.

#### **BACKGROUND**

The Cabrillo College Foundation staff recommends a \$3M fundraising goal in outright and unbooked planned gifts. It is unknown how Covid-19 will affect giving in our community. The following is an outline of the specific fundraising targets for the year to reach \$3M, which represent a 6% reduction from the 2019-20 actual totals, with the exception of unbooked planned gifts which remains at the annual \$500,000 target. Board nominates and approves all members. Initial appointments are one-year term. Subsequent appointments are three-year terms. Community Directors may serve a maximum of seven years. Past Presidents serve additional bonus year beyond regular term limit. All appointments end June 30, of expiration year.

Eight (8) of the Directors shall be representatives of Cabrillo College, at least one (1) of whom shall be a full-time faculty member of Cabrillo College. The College's Superintendent/President, three (3) Vice Presidents, and three (3) College Trustees will be selected to serve on the Foundation Board.

Cabrillo College Representatives shall hold office for three (3) years, except in the event of an earlier termination of any such Director's status as a representative of the College. In that event, such a Director's term of office shall end at the same time as that Director ceases to be a College representative. There is no limit on the number of consecutive three-year terms a Director who is a representative of Cabrillo College may serve.

# Cabrillo College Foundation Board Member Responsibilities

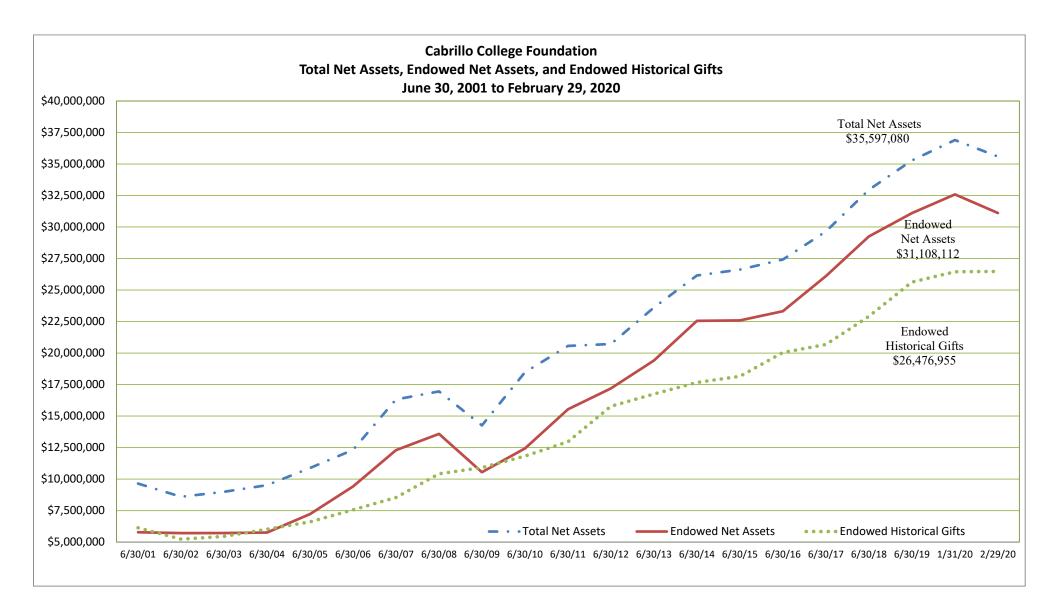
- 1. Cabrillo College Foundation Directors are valuable contributors to the workings of the Board and the Foundation. Each is expected to become familiar with Foundation's goals, structure, and bylaws.
- 2. Directors are expected to attend quarterly board meetings in September, November, February, and May. Meetings begin at 12:00 noon in Sesnon House; luncheon is served. All Directors are expected to pay for the cost of quarterly meeting luncheons. The cost is \$85 annually.
- 3. Directors participate on at least one of the following committees:

Audit Committee Executive Committee Finance and Investments Committee Cabrillo Advancement Program (CAP) Committee Faculty Grants Committee
Nominating Committee
President's Circle Committee
Scholarship Committee

Women's Educational Success Committee

- 4. Each Director is expected to personally contribute annually to the Foundation in an amount appropriate to the individual's financial circumstances. Directors are encouraged to join the President's Circle.
- 5. Because the purpose of the Foundation is to increase financial support to the college, Directors are expected to actively participate in raising funds through personal contributions, identification of donors, and solicitation of prospects. Staff assists with these activities.
- 6. Directors are encouraged to become members of the Heritage Club. The Heritage Club, a program of the Cabrillo College Foundation, honors those who have remembered Cabrillo College in their will or trust.
- 7. Directors are expected to communicate the Foundation's message to associates in the community.
- 8. Directors are expected to review minutes and related documents prior to each designated meeting.
- 9. Directors are advised to handle situations involving a conflict of interest with discretion and integrity.
- 10. Directors are expected to understand and follow Brown Act regulations.
- 11. Directors may serve a maximum of seven years including the initial year and two threeyear terms. Presidents may serve an additional year as Past President. Directors that are college representatives serve renewable three year terms.

**SUBJECT:** Scholarship Program

While Cabrillo is affordable, rising textbook prices and the high cost of living in Santa Cruz County continue to be huge financial obstacles for our students. Cabrillo is fortunate to have a robust scholarship program that helps alleviate some of these burdens, allowing our students reach their educational goals. During the uncertainty of Covid-19, scholarships help students plan for their future — knowing that they have financial support can encourage them to stay enrolled and gives them hope during challenging times.

#### **SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM**

- Last year we awarded \$1 million in scholarships to 1358 students
- Recipient selection for the 2020 scholarship cycle is in progress and the foundation is working closely with the Financial Aid office to administer 375 scholarships in four different categories:
  - 1. Department Scholarships
    - Foundation works with over 50 faculty members to ensure 210 scholarships are awarded to eligible students
  - 2. Organization/Donor Scholarships
    - Foundation works with outside organizations and individual donors to create applications and/or supply eligible applicants from "general applicant pool", as well as provide guidance to selection committees and assistance in awarding scholarships.
  - 3. General Scholarships
    - Foundation provides Financial Aid office with a list of 100 scholarships that are awarded through the General Scholarship application and selection process.
  - 4. High School Scholarships
    - Foundation and Financial Aid office work with local high schools, encouraging students to complete online applications. Foundation manages awarding process.
       Several hundred high school scholarships are awarded each year.
- This year's scholarship recipients will be notified of their awards at the end of May by the Financial
  Aid Office and will receive instructions on obtaining their scholarship funds. Awards will be
  distributed at the beginning of the fall Semester.

Due to concerns regarding COVID-19, we have cancelled many of our scholarship events.
