Call to Order - Claire Biancalana called the meeting to order at 9:01 am

Approval of Agenda

Motion: MSC: O.Brown /R. Spencer. The committee voted unanimously to approve the Executive Committee agenda.

Public Comment Opportunity

There were no members of the public in attendance.

Approve Executive Committee Minutes

Motion: MSC: L. Burroughs/G. Ruder. Pegi Ard, Claire Biancalana, Owen Brown, Linda Burroughs, David Heald and Matt Wetstein voted to approve the Executive Committee Minutes of August 27, 2020. Gun Ruder and Rachael Spencer abstained.

Cabrillo College President Report

Matt Wetstein reported that the 2020-21 final budget for the college was approved at the October Trustees meeting. The budget is stable and the college is receiving the same funding as last year. Through various cost cutting measures, including the mostly closed campus, the college will head into the next year with a surplus. This will be important considering the anticipated budget cuts for next year.

Matt reported that the decision has been made to hold 90% of classes online through fall of 2021. The college is prepared to pivot to face-to-face instruction in relation to the COVID-19 health guidelines we receive from the state and county.

Matt reported on the exploration of Cabrillo College changing its name. A task force has been created to offer advice and establish principals to guide the process of exploring a potential name change. Owen Brown, the Foundation's representative on the task force, reported that they had their kick-off meeting and have begun developing operating processes and formulating principles. They are using models from other institutions that have gone through this process. The task force will begin gathering community input in the spring.

Executive Director Report

Eileen Hill reported that the Foundation staff has been working on the audit and continuing outreach to donors through our virtual events. Staff are taking advantage of professional development webinars and virtual conferences. Eileen reported that the Foundation has received

\$20,000 from PAMF for Cabrillo allied health programs, a \$100,000 grant from the Davison family to support women in engineering and \$125,000 from the Barbara Samper Foundation for CAP. A total of \$638,070 has been raised in the first quarter of the fiscal year towards the \$3M goal.

Approve Financial Statements

Pegi Ard reported as of June 30, 2020, the total assets were \$37.1M, \$700k under prior year. Net assets were \$34.2M, \$1.1M under prior year. The total revenue for unrestricted, non-endowed and endowed funds was \$3.5M. Total expenses were \$4.6M with a deficit for all funds of \$1.1M. The total operating revenue was \$1.1M and expenses \$990K. The operating surplus was \$152K.

Motion: MSC: P. Ard/G. Ruder The committee voted unanimously to approve the June 30, 2020 Post-Audit Financial Statements.

Pegi reported that there was nothing significant to report for the July 31, 2020 and August 31, 2020 Financial Statements.

Pegi reported as of September 30, 2020, the total assets were \$37.2M, \$475K over prior year. Net assets were \$35.5M, \$200K over prior year. Both increases are due to the increase in value of the assets in investment accounts. The total revenue for unrestricted, non-endowed and endowed funds was \$2.0M. Total expenses were \$715K with a surplus for all funds of \$1.3M. The total operating revenue was \$235K and expenses \$222K. The operating surplus was \$13K.

Motion: MSC: P. Ard/D. Heald. The committee voted unanimously to approve the July 31, 2020 through September 30, 2020 Financial Statements.

2019-20 Audit Draft

Nancy Machado reported that the Cabrillo College Foundation Audit Committee was informed that the Cabrillo College Foundation received an unmodified opinion for 2019-10 and there were no difficulties encountered during the audit process. The Audit Committee accepted the 2019-20 Draft Audit report on October 7, 2020 and is recommending Executive Committee accept the 2019-20 Draft Audit Report.

The ending net assets balance as of September 30, 2020 was \$35,506,793. The endowed net assets balance was \$31,342,275. The endowed historical gifts value was \$26,701,713.

President's Circle

Linda Burroughs reported that the President's Circle Committee Kick-off Meeting was held on 9/10 via Zoom and there was a great turnout. Vance Landis Carey is co-chairing the committee with Duf and Paula Fischer this year and they announced our ambitious goal of \$398,000. Although it has been a long standing tradition to exceed the previous year's record—which was a whopping \$425,000, the committee felt that it was important to plan for a bit of attrition this year. Although

invitations have not gone out yet, \$87,427 has been raised, which is about \$10K ahead of last year at this time.

WES

Rachael Spencer reported that the committee hosted its first ever virtual WES event on September 25 and it was a big success. Ninety-four guests attended the Zoom event and we received a great deal of positive feedback about the experience. Three recent grant recipients joined the event to share their stories, and one of our Cabrillo graduates was kind enough to do a recorded interview that was played at the beginning of the event. She is currently working toward becoming a Physician's Assistant and her words made a big impact.

More than 1,800 students have received WES grants since the program's inception in 1997 and over \$700,000 has been disbursed! This year, we are able to award \$90,000 to students in need at Cabrillo, thanks to our growing WES endowment. To date, we have raised \$173,000 from nearly 400 donors—\$16,000 ahead of what we had raised last year at this time. Additional WES gifts made through the end of the year will be allocated to the 2020 campaign.

Scholarships

Rachael Spencer reported that despite so much uncertainty in our world right now, scholarships are helping students plan for their future. This critical financial support encourages them to stay enrolled and gives them hope when they need it most. Over \$1.6 million in scholarships was awarded to 2,236 students during the 2019-20 fiscal year.

The Scholarship Committee will convene in November to discuss our year-end mailing to scholarship donors and how we can help to personalize their letters and thank them in a meaningful way.

Faculty Grants

Owen Brown reported that the Cabrillo College Foundation has three grant programs to support Cabrillo College faculty. Grant recipients are selected through an annual proposal process. This year, there is \$117,990 available to award, thanks to our growing endowments. Over the last month, Faculty and Staff have been busy creating and submitting their proposals. The deadline was October 9 and we received 50 applications. Deans are currently reviewing all proposals within their divisions to approve and prioritize before the committee begins the selection process. The committee is planning to meet November 20, from 1:00-4:00pm via Zoom to make final selections and grant recipients will be notified in December.

Fire Relief Emergency Grants

Eileen Hill reported that the Cabrillo College Foundation Board of Directors took action to make funds available to provide emergency funding to Cabrillo students and staff impacted by the CZU Lightning Fire Complex to help keep students in school and support our Cabrillo employees as they rebuild their lives. The Board aimed to provide \$550 Fire Relief Emergency Grants to Cabrillo students and staff members affected, with additional grant funding provided if additional funds were available. Board Directed scholarship funds were approved by the Board to provide Fire Relief Emergency Grants and additional funds were raised. A total of \$236,659 is available in the fund and \$104,350 has been disbursed. The balance of Fire Relief funds will be available to help those in the fire area who may be impacted again in the winter.

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Student Veterans Endowment

Eileen Hill reported Cabrillo student veterans were motivated to start a permanent endowment fund to help fellow student veterans in need, for generations to come. As a result, the SVE (Student Veterans Endowment) was established in the summer of 2020 by a committee called the Quick Reaction Force (QRF). The student veterans are inspiring in their dedication to help their fellow veterans through this campaign and are modeling their campaign after WES. The goal of the QRF is to raise \$10,000 from 100 donors giving \$100 or more. Personal invitations to give to the SVE and attend the Veterans "to go" BBQ were sent on October 1. The Veterans "to go" BBQ will be held on Veterans Day, November 11. Donors who give \$100 or more will be recognized with an honorary dog tag.

A Record \$2.6 Million Donation to the Foundation

The Foundation received word in December of a record donation from an anonymous donor to support the HUB and tutoring/peer support learning programs. The donation of \$2.6 million will provide an ongoing endowment that ensures student employment levels will be enhanced in the HUB and learning centers. A portion of the funds will be used immediately to supplement tutoring services in the current semester so that online students have access to Cabrillo tutors to help complete classes successfully this spring. In future years, the interest earnings from the endowment will be used to ensure that roughly 20 students can be employed in peer learning positions as tutors, supplemental instruction leaders, or peer mentors. Kudos to Foundation Director Eileen Hill and her entire team for their work to obtain such a significant and transformational grant that supports student learning and our Guided Pathways implementation.

CARES Act Part 3 – More COVID Relief Coming to Cabrillo

The passage of the COVID Relief bill in December has resulted in an increased level of federal support for community colleges. As of January 7, Cabrillo is still waiting to hear the exact total of our allocation, but there are indications that it will be substantially more than the prior COVID relief package in the March 2020 CARES Act/HEERF Bill. One condition in the new law is a requirement that colleges provide, at a minimum, the same level of direct support to students found in the prior bill. Last April, the college received \$2.1 million in direct funding to provide grants to needy students, so another round of \$2.1 million is guaranteed this spring. There are additional allocations that will come to the college as a Hispanic Serving Institution and for the institutional allocation in the law. That last component will be higher this time around because Congress allocated more funding to higher education institutions, and because the new formula for allocation places greater emphasis on head counts of students.

A Comment on Events in Washington, DC

Like most Americans, I was saddened by the insurrection and chaos that played out in Washington, DC at the Capitol last Wednesday. There is no place in our society for such violence and destruction, especially when it is targeting the orderly functioning of government and the peaceful transition of power from one administration to another. The response of authorities to the lawless mob that overran the Capitol Building was inadequate and exposed once again the degree that white privilege frames our structural responses to protests and mass gatherings in many places in the U.S. It sickens me that Black Lives Matter marches earlier this summer in Washington, DC were met with much more force. The fact that President Trump incited the riot with his words, failed to condemn it forcefully, and in fact expressed love and support for its participants, demonstrated once again that he is unfit to remain in office.

Despite the events of last week, I remain hopeful that the Biden Administration will restore dignity and respect to the executive branch of the national government. Additionally, I am hopeful that our institution's focus on diversity, equity, antiracism, and inclusion efforts will help advance our college's ability to advance mutual respect and equitable completion. In that regard, I want to thank Kofi Akinjide for his excellent work in the Equity Certificate Program at Cabrillo, and his willingness to challenge us as leaders to understand the significance of our history or structural racism and our responsibility to dismantle racist policies and practices.

(1) Balance Sheet

• Total Assets:

Total assets of \$42.2M are \$4.2M over prior year primarily due to the combined increases in the cash and investment accounts.

• Receivables:

Total pledges receivable are \$464K less than prior year. This is a combination of pledge payments received in the first five months of this fiscal year and write off of a \$210K receivable that was on the books last year at this time.

• Liabilities:

Total Liabilities of \$1.8M are \$238K over prior year primarily due to the PPP loan of \$102,569 we obtained on June 26, 2020 and increases in accrued expenses and scholarship liabilities.

Net Assets:

Total net assets of \$40.5M are \$4M over prior year.

(2) Income Statement

• Revenue:

Total Revenue is \$5.1M higher than prior year. Earned income is \$2.5M higher compared to prior year due to investment income and Contributions are \$2.6M higher than prior year.

• Expenses:

Total Expenses of \$1.0M are \$41K higher than prior year. Scholarships expenses were \$51K higher than prior year. This fiscal year we allocated funds raised to support Cabrillo employees and students who were impacted by the August 2020 wildfires.

• Surplus/Deficit:

As of November 30, 2020, the Cabrillo College Foundation has a \$6.3M surplus compared to prior year surplus of \$1.2M.

(3) Operational Budget to Actual

• Revenue:

Operating revenue of \$358K is \$56K favorable vs budget. The endowment management fee is \$26K better than budget and President's Circle is \$24K over projected for the first five months of the fiscal year.

• Expenses:

Operating expenses of \$366K are \$37K favorable vs projection.

• Surplus/Deficit:

The operating fund deficit is \$8K compared to last year's surplus of \$30.8K due to lower contributed income from unrestricted gifts and earned income the first five months of this fiscal year.


Long-Term Portfolio Summary As of December 31, 2020





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
Cabrillo College Foundation ESG Long-Term Portfolio Summary As of December 31, 2020





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
Intermediate Portfolio Summary As of December 31, 2020





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





SUBJECT: Cabrillo Advancement Program (CAP) Update

Background

The Cabrillo Advancement Program (CAP) is a scholarship and support program designed to increase the academic success of high risk, low income students and to support their preparation for attending college. CAP includes 350 participants in 12 schools throughout Santa Cruz County. CAP scholars are selected through a competitive process open to students who qualify for free or reduced lunches.

Beginning with the first year of middle school and continuing through high school, CAP students receive after-school tutoring and participate in counseling and extra-curricular activities that sustain their commitment to preparing for college. Students who complete CAP receive \$3,000 in scholarships upon high school graduation for their first and second year at Cabrillo.

Due to Covid and challenges in online learning, the following adjustments have been made this year:

- Postponed recruitment of new 6th graders and CAP Awards Ceremony until Spring 2022. Two cohorts per school of 6th graders and 7th graders (7th graders that would have been selected as 6th graders spring 2021) will be selected.
- CAP Staff (Liz and CAP Advisors) are meetings with students virtually (Zoom, Google meets), and checking in on families.
- CAP Peer Advisors are holding virtual hours weekly or bi-weekly (depending on school).
- CAP Peer Advisors continue to check in with individual students in their "caseload" virtually
- Plan and implement "CAP Summer Institute by mail" An innovative way to have students
 access a modified summer institute experience under the circumstances. Per our survey,
 students DO NOT wish to have a virtual Summer Institute (Zoom fatigue). Instead we will
 mail an activity packet (with goodies) for kids to complete over the summer at their leisure.
 Once completed we will have a way to see who logged in and raffle prizes for participants.
- Administrative work to digitize all materials, migrate to new Cabrillo website, and update CAP database, distribute CAP Scholarships virtually, and finalizing CAP 6th Grade recruitment video

SUBJECT: Scholarship Program

While Cabrillo is affordable, rising textbook prices and the high cost of living in Santa Cruz County continue to be huge financial obstacles for our students. Denise Mar is one of the many Cabrillo students who has been helped on her educational path though scholarship support from the tremendous generosity of our donors. At a donor event last year, she shared:



When I got into the nursing program at Cabrillo, it was an amazing joy for my family and myself. I remember crying out of happiness when I found out, but I knew it would be difficult financially. Every day I was so excited to be in the program, but at the same time I was worried that I wasn't going to be able to continue.

But when I found out I was a scholarship recipient, I was so happy and relieved. I felt so blessed that there was such kind people who were investing in my education and that believed in me. It's such a luxury to not have to work. I get to focus on my studies and go to office hours instead of rushing to work after class.

Once I graduate, I hope to find a job here in the Santa Cruz community and give back to the community that has given so much to me. Being a scholarship recipient has changed my life for the best. Thank you for your generosity and allowing me to continue to pursue my dreams of becoming a Nurse.
