Call to Order – K. Semingson called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m.

Approval of Agenda

Approve Audit Committee Minutes:

Motion: MSC: D. Heald/ B. Scherer: The committee voted unanimously to approve the Audit Committee Minutes of October 7, 2022.

Executive Director's Report

Cabrillo College graduated over 1,300 students and 50% were Latinx students. Early fall enrollment numbers are up 5% but are not at the pre-pandemic level.

Eileen Hill reported that Foundation staff has returned to in-person work and some events and meetings in-person.

Eileen reported that as of April 11, 2022, the Cabrillo College Foundation has raised \$5,682,350 towards a goal of \$3M. This includes \$2.3M in unbooked planned gifts, including a gift of a home. President's Circle reached an all-time high of over \$500,000 rasied.

A Cabrillo Gallery lighting project mini campaign, Veteran's endowment campaign and Cabrillo employee payroll deduction campaign have added to the fundraising totals this fiscal year. Eileen gave a graphical representation of the Foundation's disbursements to Cabrillo College and students from July 1, 2021 to March 31, 2022 totaling \$1.9M, \$1,236,083 in scholarships to students.

Review 2020-21 Audit

Kirsten Moore reported that the audit went well, the foundation received a clean report and there were no issues.

Discuss 2021-22 Audit

Kirsten Moore explained the focus of the audit would be on revenue recognition with special focus on grants to and from the foundation that could a have a right of return and barriers.

Kirsten prefers a remote audit but did indicate that she could have a staff member come to the foundation to help relieve the staff time needed for all of the document scanning.

Auditor Selection:

The committee reviewed past audit costs and proposed audit and tax filing costs of **Eide Bailley.** The following details the audit costs for the 2016-2021 audits:

- 2017-18\$12,350
- 2018-19\$12,700
- 2019-20\$13,000
- 2020-21\$13,400
- 2021-22\$17,500 (increase due to employee costs at EideBailly)

The prices for FY 2023, 2024 and 2025 are significantly higher and over our projected budget for the audits and 990 filing.

Karen Semingson indicated that she thought we have been getting a great deal in the past and that with a new company it makes sense that the prices were reset, however, they are at the top end of the scale. Barbara Scherer also thought the prices were high and thought the partner should have been at the meeting. David Heald also thought the prices were high but informed Karen and Barbara that we are in the process of an Investment Consultant RFP and if we do change advisors, there will be a great deal of work to be done by staff. Barbara and Karen agreed and thought having an auditor familiar with the foundation would be easiest during audit if we were to change investment advisors.

MSC:D. Heald/K. Semingson: Approve retaining EideBailly for audit services for the 2022/23 audit and go out for RFP for the 2023/24 audit.


Cabrillo College FOUNDATION 2021-22 FACULTY AND DEPARTMENT SUPPORT \$507,267


