Call to Order

Patty Quillin called the meeting to order at 12:38 pm.

Approval of Agenda

Motion: MSC: R. Allen/K.Cowan. The Board voted unanimously to approve the Board agenda.

Public Comment Opportunity

There were no members of the public in attendance.

Special Presentations

Patty Quillin introduced Angelo DeBernardo and David Jacobs of CalCPA Attorneys, Bankers, and CPAs Group. CalCPA established a scholarship endowment over a decade ago to support students at Cabrillo with an interest in pursuing a career in Accounting, Finance or Law. Angelo and David presented a check for \$5,600 to add to the endowment this year.

Eileen Hill gave a brief overview of the Faculty Grants for Student Success program and then introduced Jo-Ann Panzardi, Chair, Cabrillo College Engineering Department and Sylvia Rios, Ceramics Artist and Instructor, Cabrillo College who shared their Engineering Tree Mural project which was funded by a faculty grant.

2022-23 Board Members

Patty Quillin introduced new Board members Sesario Escoto, Diane Koenig, Vance Landis-Carey, Amy Lehman-Seston, Robin McFarland and Ron Sekkel. All Board members and CCF staff introduced themselves.

<u>Cabrillo College President Report</u>

Matt Wetstein reported that Cabrillo is doing very well this year in terms of state funding. He also described how Cabrillo College compares to the state averages on enrollment, funding, degrees and certificates and demographics. The decline in enrollment at Cabrillo has bottomed out, and is hopefully on its way back up. Matt reported that 51% of Cabrillo's graduating seniors last semester were Hispanic demonstrating that the equity gap for degree completion is closing.

The college is still working to determine how best to serve students both virtually and in person. We've found that offering counseling appointments virtually is essential for students. Virtual Counseling appointments have a 90% attendance rate, compared to in person appointments that have a 65% attendance rate. We know it's important to keep both options available for students.

Matt reported that last year, Cabrillo's application to the state for funding to support the construction of on-campus housing for students was declined and instead Cabrillo received money for project planning. Cabrillo has the opportunity to submit an application again and will be collaborating with UCSC on a joint housing project. Priority is being given to projects that are intersegmental. The original Cabrillo application was for about 300 beds, adding another 300 for UCSC students to potentially double the number of students served within the same footprint proposed previously.

Matt informed the group that the Cabrillo Name Exploration Committee is writing the report and recommendation regarding the potential name change and will present this to the Board of Trustees at their November 14, 2022 meeting.

Executive Director Report

Eileen reported that for the 2021-22 fiscal year, the Cabrillo College Foundation raised \$6,257,033, which includes \$1.8M in endowed permanent support. As of September 2, 2022, the Foundation has raised \$646,949 towards a goal of \$3M.

Eileen reported on various proposals that have been funded or pending. One is supporting the nursing program to purchase high fidelity manikins with different skin tones and to build curriculum to teach cultural humility in caregiving. The other recently funded proposal is funding from the Davidson Family Foundation for women in engineering. We have a proposal pending to launch a Rising Scholars program at Cabrillo to offer education in jails and an on-campus program to support formerly incarcerated students at Cabrillo.

Eileen informed the group that Tom Sourisseau's estate named the Cabrillo College Foundation as one of the primary beneficiaries. A gift of approximately \$1M is expected. The Foundation is working on naming the Allied Health building after Tom in honor of the hundreds of healthcare workers who got their start in Tom's anatomy class.

Eileen gave a graphical representation of the Foundation's disbursements to Cabrillo and students from July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022 totaling \$2.2M, \$1,343,451 in scholarships to students.

Approve Financial Statements

Trevor Strudley reported as of June 30, 2022, total assets of \$43.4M were \$4.2M under prior year primarily due to the decrease in the value of the assets in the investment accounts. Total net assets of \$40.4M were \$4.5M less than prior year. Total Revenue was \$14.6M lower than prior year. Total Expenses of \$4.3M were \$655K over prior year with a deficit of \$4.6M. The total operating revenue was \$1M and expenses were \$957K. The operating fund surplus was \$75,666. The foundation was able to fulfill the goal of having 9 months (\$867,658) of operating reserve.

Motion: MSC: K. Cogswell /J. Thiebaut. The Board voted unanimously to approve the June 30, 2022 Post Audit Financial Statements.

Trevor Strudley reported as of July 31, 2022, total assets of \$44.7M were \$2.5M under prior year primarily due to the decrease in the value of the assets in the investment accounts. Total net assets of \$42.1M were \$2.8M less than prior year. Total Revenue was \$2M more than prior year. Total Expenses of \$348K were \$233K over prior year with a surplus of \$1.7K. The total operating revenue was \$94K and expenses were \$88K. The operating fund surplus was \$5K post audit.

Motion: MSC: K. Cowan/S. Escoto. The Board voted unanimously to approve the July 31, 2022 Post Audit Financial Statements.

Investment Advisor Search

Trevor Strudley gave an overview of the investment advisor RFP process and outcome.

Motion: MSC: K. Cogswell/K. Wilson. The Board voted to hire investment advisor Brown Advisory for the Cabrillo College Foundation's endowed, nonendowed, and federal endowed funds (six portfolios). Rachel Wedeen recused herself from the vote.

President's Circle

Karen Cogswell reported that the President's Circle Committee had a record-breaking year last year, raising \$502,300–a 9% increase over the previous year. 28 new members joined and they maintained a 94% retention rate for rejoining members. Linda Burroughs and Karen Cogswell are teaming up to co-chair the President's Circle Committee for the 2022-23 campaign. They welcome five new committee members to our group this year: Mike Allard, Diane Koenig, Robin McFarland, Ron Sekkel and Margie Sisk.

WES

Rachael Spencer reported that over 2,100 students have received WES grants since the program's inception in 1997 and nearly \$900,000 has been disbursed to date. This year, \$110,000 was awarded to students in need at Cabrillo. Freny Cooper and Mary Culley are the co-chairs for the 2022 WES Campaign and personalized invitations were recently sent to approx. 1,700 donors and prospects, inviting them to support the program. The Foundation is receiving gifts daily and so far \$153,601 has been raised this year. Donations of \$250 are being matched by a generous \$20,000 grant from the Sharanam Foundation and the Wedeen Hammer Locatelli Group at Morgan Stanley. The WES Luncheon will be held in person at the Samper Recital Hall on September 30.

Scholarships

Julie Thiebaut reported that over \$1.6 million in scholarships was awarded to over 1,500 students during the 2021-22 fiscal year. Now that the semester is in full swing, most students have received their scholarship funds. In August, the foundation sent thank you cards to over 200 scholarship donors. The cards included the names of their 2022 scholarship recipients and a message of gratitude. The Scholarship Committee plans to meet in November.

Cabrillo Advancement Program

Maria Esther Rodriguez gave an overview of the CAP program. Beginning with the first year of middle school and continuing through high school, CAP students receive after-school tutoring and participate in counseling and extra-curricular activities that sustain their commitment to preparing for college. Students who complete CAP receive \$3,000 in scholarships upon high school graduation for their first and second year at Cabrillo. The CAP Committee is gearing up for more in person activities this year. They are in the process of selecting a date for the first inperson CAP ceremony and in-person CAP Summer Institute in three years!

Student Veterans Endowment

Cory Ray reported that the Student Veterans Endowment has grown to \$44,500. Six rapid response grants have been awarded in the amount of \$500 each to help our students veterans stay on their path. A total of \$1,500 will be available to award for the 2022-23 academic year.

2021-22 Audit Schedule

Nancy Machado reported that the 2021-22 Cabrillo College Foundation audit is in process.

SUBJECT: Acceptance of FY 2021-22 Audit

BACKGROUND

The Cabrillo College Foundation Audit Committee was informed that the Cabrillo College Foundation received an unmodified opinion for 2021-22 and there were no difficulties encountered during the audit process. The Audit Committee accepted the 2021-22 Draft Audit report on October 6, 2022. The Executive Committee accepted the 2021-22 Draft Audit Report on October 24, 2022.

Auditor Review:

The Statement of Financial Position for 2021-22 reflects net assets of \$43M compared to \$48M for 2020-21.

The Statement of Activities for 2021-22 notes a change in net assets of (\$4.5M) which is \$15.2M less than the change in net assets reported in 2020-21.

The Statement of Functional Expenses for 2021-22 shows expenses \$586K more than prior year.

RECOMMENDED MOTION

Accept 2021-22 Audit.

CABRILLO COLLEGE FOUNDATION September 30, 2022 Post-Audit Condensed Narrative Updated October 28, 2022

(1) Balance Sheet

Total Assets:

Total assets of \$40.1M are \$5.7M under prior year primarily due to the decrease in value of the assets in the investment accounts.

Receivables:

Total pledges receivable are \$291K less than prior year primarily due to an annual pledge payment of \$300K and other pledge payments.

• Liabilities:

Total Liabilities of \$1.7M are \$117K more than prior year primarily due to increased scholarships awarded, CAP scholarships awarded and accounts payable.

Net Assets:

Total net assets of \$38.4M are \$5.9M less than prior year.

(2) Income Statement

Revenue:

Total Revenue is \$1.3M less than prior year. Earned income is -\$1.9M compared to the prior year balance of -\$189K. Contributed income of \$759K is \$429K higher than prior year.

• Expenses:

Total Expenses of \$776K are \$24K higher than prior year due to increased scholarships awarded and program payments to the college.

• Surplus/Deficit:

As of September 30, 2022, the Cabrillo College Foundation has a \$1,95M deficit compared to prior year's deficit of \$611K.

(3) Operational Budget to Actual

• Revenue:

Operating revenue of \$140K is \$143K unfavorable vs budget. Earned income is \$101K unfavorable vs budget. Contributed income is \$41K unfavorable vs budget.

• Expenses:

Operating expenses of \$273 are \$12K favorable vs projection.

• Surplus/Deficit:

The operating fund deficit is \$133K post audit.

New Title V HSI Grant for \$3 Million & CCAMPIS Grant for \$970,000

The college learned late last week that it will receive a new Title V HSI Grant from the U.S. Department of Education worth \$3 million over 5 years. This grant will help deepen our partnership with Pajaro Valley Unified School District to expand dual enrollment and to better align our college pathways program with the local high school districts and the career pathways they have designed. This news came about a week after we had learned of approval of a CCAMPIS Grant (Child Care Access Means Parents in Schools) valued at \$970,000 over four years. That grant will allow for expanded access to child care services for our students and better parenting training and coaching. Kudos to all involved for these grant efforts, but I particularly want to call out Carrie Mulcaire for her efforts to organize and submit these proposals. Carrie has an incredible ability to synthesize ideas into project narratives and logic models…her track record of grant success is impressive.

Appointment as Co-Chair of Affordability, Food, Housing Access Task Force Co-Chair

Early in September, I was appointed as co-chair of the statewide CEO/CCLC Affordability, Food, and Housing Access Task Force (along with Tammeil Gilkerson, President of Evergreen Valley College). The Task Force has had success in recent years lobbying for additional funding to support the basic needs of students, and in securing housing funding for the CCC sector. The Task Force also helps plan and organize the annual Real College California Basic Needs Summit, planned this year for Dec. 9 at San Bernardino Valley College.

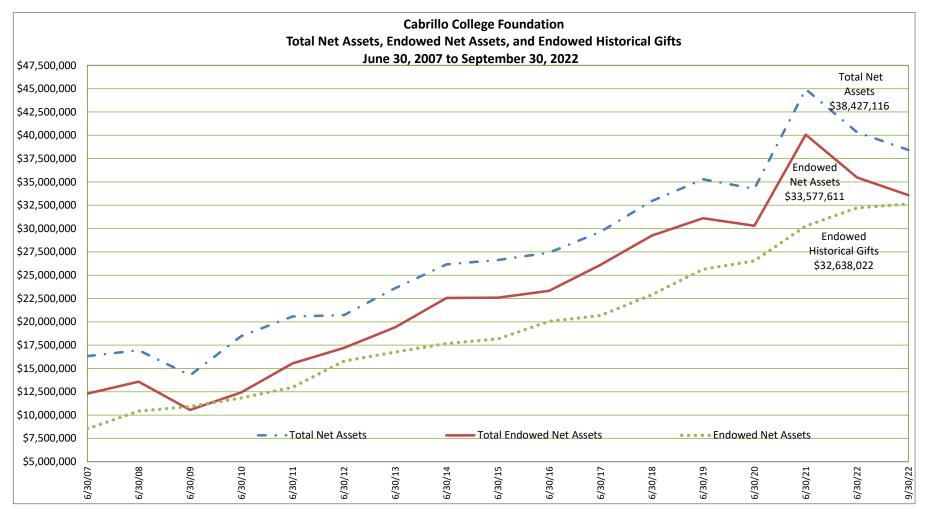

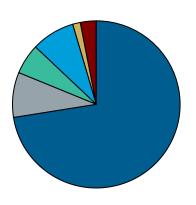

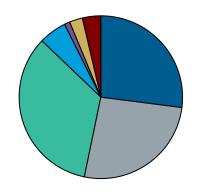

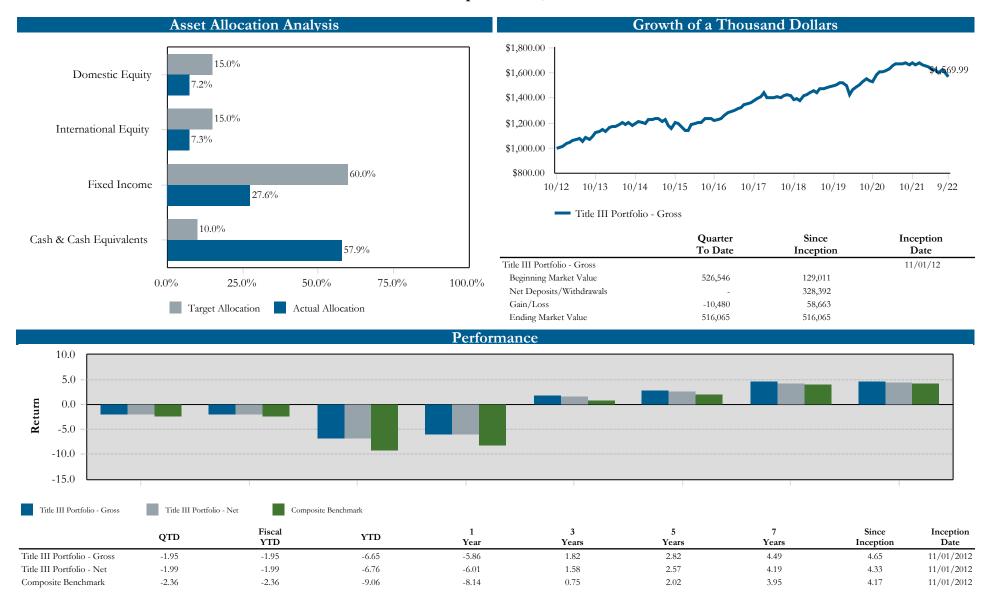
Short-Term Portfolio Summary As of September 30, 2022

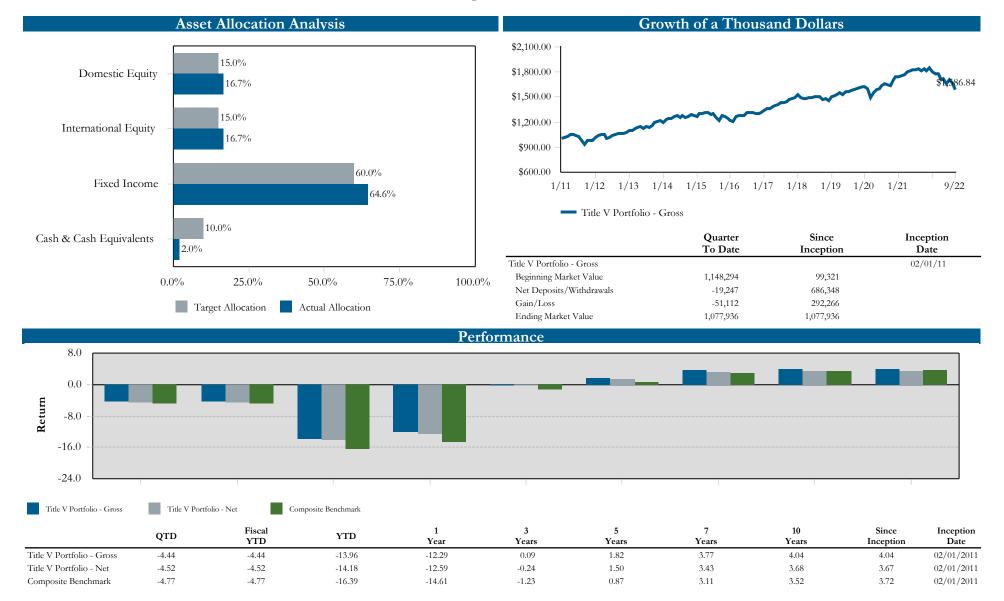

WES grants are a critical resource for staff and faculty on campus, empowering them to send a lifeline to a struggling student. This year a total of \$110,000 will be given out to students in need and by the end of the 2022-23 academic year, we will have awarded over \$1 million to students since the program's inception in 1997!

EVENT:

- After two years of hosting the WES event virtually, we were finally able to celebrate in person!
- The event was held on Friday, September 30 at the Samper Recital Hall on the Cabrillo campus in Aptos.
- The program was held inside (masks required) and lasted 38 minutes.
- It was the 25th anniversary of WES and we were very happy to recognize our first donors or "Founding Mothers" and co-founder of WES, Rachael Spencer during the program
- Four students and one Cabrillo alumna spoke about the profound impact receiving a WES grant when they needed help.
- Boxed lunches prepared by the Farm Bakery were offered following the program and guests could chose to stay and enjoy their lunches at tables outside the Recital Hall, or take them to go.
- A total of 118 guests attended



WES recipient Bridgette Madrigal was one of our student speakers. She is a 36-year-old single mother of 3 and her ambition is to become a dietitian and RN or PA. She is working so hard in school and shared her gratitude at the WES event:

The WES grant helped me not only by paying for the cost of my school books, but also helped me sustain financial responsibilities for me and my children. You have no idea how much this means to me and my family, to have these resources and help from our community. I have no doubt I will excel at my goals and dreams thanks to all the support Cabrillo College has to offer and to you.

I am honored to have been a part of the event, surrounded by such an amazing and powerful group of women. I was really touched by all the women who approached me after the event to thank me. When in reality I owe all my gratitude and appreciation to them.

2022 CAMPAIGN:

- Mary Culley and Freny Cooper are co-chairs for the 2022 WES Campaign
- The WES Committee, consisting of 25 Best Friends, sent personalized WES invitations to over 1,700 potential donors, inviting them to support the program.
- As of October 31, **\$225,095** has been raised from **428** donors, over \$15,000 ahead of where we were last year at this time! WES donations made through December 31st will be included in the 2022 WES Campaign.
- The Wedeen Hammer Locatelli Group at Morgan Stanley partnered with the Sharanam Foundation to give a
 matching grant to inspire donors to potentially increase their support and give gifts of \$250 or more. The
 entire amount of \$20,000 from the Wedeen Hammer Locatelli Group and Sharanam Foundation has been
 matched.

Cabrillo College Foundation has three grant programs to support Cabrillo College faculty:

- 1. Faculty Grants for Student Success
- 2. Crocker Endowment Grants
 - Crocker Nursing Endowment Grants
 - Crocker Dental Hygiene Endowment Grants
 - Crocker VAPA Endowment Grants
 - Crocker Campus-Wide Endowment Grants
- 3. Engineering and Applied Science Endowment

This year there is \$129,841 available to award Cabrillo staff and faculty to enhance student learning and increase student success. Grant recipients are selected through an annual proposal process. In October and November of each year, various committees meet to evaluate proposals and select grant recipients for each of the three grant programs.

The deadline to apply has passed and Department Deans have completed the initial review and approval process. Crocker grant recipients are currently being selected. Once Crocker funds have been allocated, the Faculty Grants for Student Success committee will receive unfunded proposal to review. The committee will meet on November 28th to discuss projects and select recipients.

SUBJECT: Student Veterans Endowment

Background

In 2020, Cabrillo College student veterans launched the first annual Student Veterans Endowment (SVE) campaign. The Student Veterans Endowment provides rapid response grants to student veterans who experience unforeseen hardships while transitioning to civilian life. SVE grants are awarded within one week of the request and fortify students who are experiencing challenges.

The Student Veterans Endowment has grown to \$44,500. Six rapid response grants have been awarded in the amount of \$500 each to help our students veterans stay on their path. A total of \$1,500 will be available to award for the 2022-23 academic year.

20 members of the 2022 Quick Reaction Force Committee have been soliciting donors and prospects and veteran Mike Brandy will match gifts of \$100 or more, up to \$10,000. The goal is to raise over \$20,000 this year and so far \$18,975 has been raised. Donors and veterans will be honored at the annual Cabrillo Veterans BBQ on November 10th.
