Pegi Ard reported as of September 30, 2023, the total assets were \$45M, \$4.9M over prior year. Net assets were \$43M, \$4M more than prior year. The total revenue for unrestricted, non-endowed and endowed funds was \$1, 235,804. Total expenses were \$1,220,348 with a surplus for all funds of \$15K. The total operating revenue was \$253K and expenses \$307K. The operating fund deficit is \$54K.

These grants will help build a first-year experience for students – helping them identify a pathway, creating cohorts of students with similar interests and developing first-year courses specific to their pathways. Matt invited Bradley Olin to give an update on the progress of the Student Housing Project – a collaboration between Cabrillo College and UCSC to build a student housing complex on the Cabrillo campus. Bradley gave an overview of the project and plans going forward. It is still the early stages, at this time, it is estimated to open for the 2026-27 academic year.

Executive Director's Report

Eileen reported that Foundation staff have been working on the annual report, Cabrillo Retiree engagement and professional development at the National Conference for Community College Foundations.

Eileen Hill reported that so far, \$3,303,729 has been raised this fiscal year.

The Cabrillo Advancement Program (CAP) is in the process of selecting the next 6th grade cohort and awarding scholarships to the cohorts entering college (Cabrillo and those going direct to 4-year universities).

The Foundation has been working on various proposals, including \$130k from Monterey Peninsula Foundation to support the Stroke and Disability Learning Center.

The ending net assets balance as of September 30, 2023 was \$42,965,915. The endowed net assets balance was \$38,348,201. The endowed historical gifts value was \$35,137,144.

Pegi Ard reviewed CCF investments as of September 30, 2023.

Women's Educational Success

Kathryn Cowan reported that this year, \$115,000 will be awarded in emergency grants to those in need. Since the program's inception in 1997, over \$1M has been awarded to 2,300 students. There was a WES celebration at the Samper Recital Hall in September with nearly 140 guests in attendance. Five students and one Cabrillo alumnus spoke about the profound impact of receiving a WES grant. As of November 13th, \$260,031 has been raised from 441 donors, about \$25,000 ahead of where we were last year at this time.

President's Circle

Karen Cogswell reported that she and Mike Allard are the committee co-chairs this year and a few new committee members have joined to group - Jan Furman, Bill and Mary McGowan and Cam and Karen Primavera. Invitations to join the President's Circle have been personalized by committee members and most were mailed out yesterday. The committee is hoping to raise at least \$500K this year and over \$100,000 has already been raised for the 2023-24 campaign. The foundation hosted an event last week for new and prospective members and about 30 guests attended. The culinary students prepared some very tasty tapas for the group and even spoke to the group about themselves and their educational goals. Two people joined that evening and three more indicated they will be sending in their donations soon.

Scholarships

Cory Ray reported that over \$1.5 million in scholarships was awarded to nearly 1,600 students during the 2022-23 fiscal year. The foundation hosted a reception for scholarship donors and Cabrillo supporters at the end of October. Just over 100 guests attended, including six scholarship recipients who spoke during the program. The students did a fantastic job sharing their stories and their gratitude for the scholarship support they received. All of them hope to one day serve their communities in some capacity, which was so encouraging to learn. Everyone was moved by these students and it was a great reminder of why we love to give to Cabrillo.

Faculty Grants

Ron Sekkel reported that the Cabrillo Foundation offers three grant programs to support Cabrillo College faculty and staff: Faculty Grants for Student Success, Crocker Endowment Grants and Engineering and Applied Science Endowment. Recipients are selected through an annual proposal process that begins in the fall and this year, there is \$136K available to award to Cabrillo faculty and staff. The proposal submission deadline closed in October and now the review and selection process is well underway. The FGSS Committee will meet on Monday, November 20th via Zoom to make recipient selections.

Student Veterans Endowment

Donna Ziel reported that the Quick Reaction Force Committee, now consisting of 18 members have sent out personalized invitations and emails to approximately 375 potential donors. Thanks to a generous grant of \$10,000 from veteran Mike Brandy, all gifts of \$100 or more will be matched. As of November 6, \$17,365 has been raised. At the annual Veterans BBQ on November 9th, veterans were honored, veteran student recipients were featured, and donors were recognized.

(1) Balance Sheet

Total Assets:

Total assets of \$52.9.M are \$9.0M more than prior year primarily due to the increase in value of the assets in the investment accounts.

• Receivables:

Total pledges receivable are \$54K less than prior year. This is the net effect of new pledges received and pledge payments received.

• Liabilities:

Total Liabilities of \$1.9M are \$798K more than prior year primarily due to the Pension, OPEB and Scholarship Liabilities.

Net Assets:

Total net assets of \$51.0M are \$8.2M more than prior year.

(2) Income Statement

• Revenue:

Total Revenue is \$6.6MK more than prior year. Earned income year to date is \$4.4M compared to the prior year balance of \$862K. Contributed income of \$5.9M is \$3.1M higher than prior year. We received \$3.1M from the estate of Tom Sourisseau.

• Expenses:

Total Expenses of \$2.1M are \$455K higher than prior year due to increased scholarships awarded, program payments to the college and the timing of those payments.







SUBJECT: Women's Educational Success (WES)

WES grants are a critical resource for faculty on campus, empowering them to send a lifeline to a struggling student. This year a total of \$115,000 will be given out to students in need by the end of the 2023-24 academic year. Since the program's inception in 1997, we have awarded over \$1 million to 2,300.

2023 CAMPAIGN

Thanks to the WES Co-chairs, Freny Cooper and Angie McClellan, and our committee of Best Friends, we had our most stellar year of fundraising for WES to date: **\$285,092 was raised from 481 donors**, about \$30,000 more than what was raised in 2022!

We were fortunate that the Wedeen Hammer Locatelli Group at Morgan Stanley partnered with the Sharanam Foundation to give a matching grant that inspired donors to increase their support and give gifts of \$250 or more.

We will begin plans for the 2024 WES Campaign in February.

BACKGROUND

The Cabrillo Advancement Program (CAP) is a scholarship and support program designed to increase the academic success of high risk, low income students and to support their preparation for attending college. CAP includes over 350 participants in 12 schools throughout Santa Cruz County. CAP scholars are selected through a competitive process open to students who qualify for free or reduced lunches.

Beginning with the first year of middle school and continuing through high school, CAP students receive after-school tutoring and participate in counseling and extra-

curricular activities that sustain their commitment to preparing for college. Students who complete CAP receive \$3,000 in scholarships upon high school graduation for their first and second year at Cabrillo.

CEREMONY

Seventy new sixth grader are currently being selected and we will be celebrating the students and their families at the CAP Ceremony on Tuesday, March 12th from 6-8pm at the Crocker Theater.

SCHOLARSHIPS

1. CAP Scholarships: \$1,500 per student

For CAP students who complete the CAP program, graduate from high school and attend Cabrillo no later than one academic year after graduation. Students must be enrolled in 12+ units at Cabrillo to receive the full scholarship award.

- 2. Barbara Samper CAP Four-year Scholarships: \$1,500 for select students

 For CAP students who graduate from high school and go directly to a four-year college.

 Proof of enrollment is required.
- 3. Barbara Samer CAP Second Year Scholarships: \$1,500 per student
 For CAP students who have completed 24 units at Cabrillo in the prior 12 months.
 Students must be enrolled in 12+ units at Cabrillo to receive the full scholarship award.
- **4. CAP Transfer Scholarships: \$1,000 \$2,500 for select students** For Cabrillo students transferring to four-year colleges.
