#### CABRILLO COLLEGE FOUNDATION Cabrillo Advancement Program (CAP) Overview

#### CAP PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Cabrillo Advancement Program (CAP) is a scholarship and support program designed to increase the academic success of high risk, low income students and to support their preparation for attending college. CAP includes over 400 participants in 12 schools throughout Santa Cruz County. CAP scholars are selected through a competitive process open to students who qualify for free or reduced lunches.

Beginning with the first year of middle school and continuing through high school, CAP students receive after-school tutoring and participate in counseling and extra-curricular activities that sustain their commitment to preparing for college. Students who complete CAP receive \$3,000 in scholarships upon high school graduation for their first and second year at Cabrillo.

#### CAP PROGRAM ELEMENTS FOR EACH MIDDLE SCHOOL

There are currently seven participating middles schools in Santa Cruz County; four middle schools in Pajaro Valley Unified School District and three middle schools in the Santa Cruz City School District. Ten 6th graders are selected at each of the seven middle schools each year, representing 70 new CAP students and their families inducted into the CAP program each year.

#### **CAP COLLABORATION AND FLEXIBILITY**

CAP is innovative and strives to meet the unique needs at each school. The CAP program adapts to promote efficient use of all support programs at each school. CAP ascertains the available resources to students and designs a plan to integrate CAP services in order to complement those services already available.

#### **SUMMARY**

The Cabrillo College Foundation considers the CAP program one of its most successful outreach efforts. CAP is a unique program that can be malleable to fit student needs. CAP provides a unique array of support services including specific college guidance, summer leadership institutes, Saturday academies and an induction ceremony. CAP also stands apart from other programs in that it involves parents and students in family activities to make the "CAP Family" a family in the truest sense. And possibly the most important aspect of the CAP program to the young 6<sup>th</sup> grade students is the awarding of \$3,000 in Cabrillo College scholarships and the notion that there are people in the community personally investing in their future success.

Julio Romero was the keynote CAP Alumnus speaker at a past CAP Awards Ceremony. He graduated from both Cabrillo College and Sacramento State University and is now a police officer in Watsonville. The highlight of his speech was when he gestured around the entire room and said,


"I look around and realize I'm making my way around this room. It was not too long ago I was sitting over there as a sixth grader, and then over there as a CAP senior, today I sit up front as a CAP Alumnus and ceremony speaker, and one day I will be over there sitting with the CAP donors."



The CAP program is opening the world of higher education, whether it is at Cabrillo College or a four-year university, to students who might otherwise miss the opportunity to obtain a college degree. CAP program expansion will allow more students, many of whom never dreamed of going to college, have it within their reach.

Maria Isabel Rodriguez, CAP Alumnae, graduated from Cabrillo College, Santa Clara University, and Stanford University with a Master's degree. She teaches World History at Pajaro Valley High School.

"My parents were farm workers and they could never have been able to pay for college and thanks to CAP I was able to go. I promised my parents and my teachers that I would come back to my community and give back what I received from it; so here I am now and I'm very excited about it."

A child of immigrants with English as his second language, Calvin is a living testament of the transformative power of access. A passionate advocate for community-building and expanded opportunity, he is committed to advancing student success and institutional excellence. His leadership is guided by a vision of financial sustainability, enriched campus experiences, strengthened organizational capacity, and a culture of belonging.

A first generation, low-income (FGLI) college graduate, he received his first college credits through dual enrollment, holds an MBA from Columbia University, an MS in Statistics from Kennesaw State University, and an MS and a BS in International Relations from Georgia Tech. In his free time, he enjoys teaching salsa dancing with his wife, training 狗狗 the rescue dog, and scuba diving around the world.



#### **Budget Status & May Revision**

The Governor will announce a May revision to his budget proposal next week at the latest. Current projections for revenues for the existing year continue to remain above forecasted estimates for the 2024-25 spending year. The California Department of Finance reported last week that through March, tax receipts were running \$4.4 billion above projected estimates for the year. Strong income tax returns in March were the leading cause for that small surplus. The on-going revenue picture has remained strong even in the face of expected negative revenue expectations because of the Los Angeles County wildfires, and tariff concerns that will likely spark a downturn in spending by consumers. For now, the Governor is still expected to propose a COLA of more than 2% in the May revise, and Prop. 98 dollars for K12 schools and community colleges are likely to remain positive as we approach the June budget deliberations.

#### Gratitude & Kudos: Athletics, Cheryl Anderson, and Cabrillo Talks!

Kudos to Coach Scott Masik and the Cabrillo men's baseball team for qualifying for the Nor-Cal State Championship Tournament for the second year in a row. The team put together a nice string of 5 straight wins in conference play to secure a bid to face number four ranked Feather River College over the weekend. Despite winning game 1 of the series 10-6, Feather River ended up taking the two final games and advancing. The team finished with a 19-23 record. Big kudos also go to Cabrillo swimmer Kaylee Gooch, who competed in the state championship meet over the weekend. Kaylee was a finalist in two events: the 400 IM (taking 7<sup>th</sup> place), and the 200 breast-stroke (finishing 6<sup>th</sup>). She also earned points as an 11<sup>th</sup> place finisher in the 200 IM. Kaylee was a multi-sport standout at Harbor HS before coming to Cabrillo. Meanwhile, the prior weekend, eight Seahawks traveled to the state tennis tournament, with Jack Van Ness being the standout who made it to the state quarterfinals before bowing out.







#### Approve Financial Statements

Karen Cogswell reported as of December 31, 2024, the total assets were \$59.5M, \$6.6M over prior year. Net assets were \$57.6M, \$6.5M more than prior year.

The total revenue for unrestricted, non-endowed and endowed funds was \$6.3M. Total expenses were \$2.1M with a surplus for all funds of \$4.1M.

The total operating revenue was \$1.0M and expenses \$629K. The operating fund surplus is \$395K.

**Motion: MSC: R.Sekkel/ J.Thiebaut.** The Board voted unanimously to approve the December 31, 2024 Financial Statements.

### <u>Form 990</u>

Motion: MSC: V. Landis/ K. Cowan. The Board voted unanimously to accept the 2023 Form 990 as presented.

### Cabrillo College President's Report

Matt Wetstein reported that enrollment at Cabrillo is up 2.5% over the prior year. The college is facing budgetary challenges due to the State funding formula. The decrease in funding results in faculty having to reduce their units which impacts their salaries as well as student access to classes.

Matt reported that the Student Housing Project is moving along and the architectural drawings will be submitted to the State architect in March. The budget is on target and the goal to break ground in the fall is on track.

Matt spoke about the two new VPs at Cabrillo, Blanca Baltazar-Sabbah, Vice President of Student Services and Calvin Yu, Vice President of Finance and Administrative Services. Matt announced that he will be retiring as President of Cabrillo College effective December 31, 2025.

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#### **Executive Director's Report**

Eileen introduced the new Development Officer at the Foundation, Jessie Palmer. The Nominating Committee will be working on Board member recruitment for the upcoming fiscal year. Eileen reported that the foundation has raised \$3,869,264 so far this fiscal year.

The Foundation is working on fundraising for the new Student Housing Childcare Center. So far \$500,000 has been raised towards the \$2M goal and a grant of \$380,000 is anticipated to come in as well. Eileen gave a graphical representation of Foundation disbursements of \$2M to Cabrillo College students, July 1, 2024 to December 31, 2024 with \$1.2M going to scholarships.

#### Review of CCF Investments as of December 31, 2024

Karen Cogswell reviewed CCF investments as of December 31, 2024.

#### <u>WES</u>

Rachel Wedeen reported that it was the best year of fundraising yet for Women's Educational Success. Over \$320,000, was raised from 524 donors, which is about \$36,000 more than what was raised in 2023. The Foundation is able to award a record \$125,000 in WES grants to students this academic year, thanks to the growing endowment. Cynthia Druley has joined Peggy Flynn as the newest committee co-chair.

#### President's Circle

Vance Landis reported that \$499,000 has been raised so far for the President's Circle this year. To date, 23 brand-new members have joined and 18 returning members increased their support. Last week, renewal reminders were sent to President's Circle donors who contributed last year but have not yet responded to this year's invitation, more President's Circle donations should be coming in soon. William Ow will host a special reception for new and prospective President's Circle members on February 20th from 5:30 to 7:00 pm at the Old Wrigley Building. Guests will have the opportunity to learn more about Cabrillo, meet President Matt Wetstein, and connect with committee members. Committee members are actively reaching out to new and prospective donors to encourage attendance at the event. So far, there are 25 confirmed RSVPs.

#### Cabrillo Advancement Program

Sesario Escoto reported that this year, 70 new 6th graders from seven local middle schools have been selected to join the Cabrillo Advancement Program (CAP). We will celebrate these students and their families at the CAP Ceremony on Tuesday, March 11th, from 6:00 to 8:00 pm at the Crocker Theater. Branciforte Middle School was the most recent addition to the CAP program in 2018 and this year, students from the first Branciforte CAP cohort are graduating from high school and will be recognized, along with other CAP graduates, at the ceremony.

#### **Scholarships**

Claire Biancalana reported that in December, committee members helped to personalize the annual year-end solicitation that was mailed to over 500 scholarship donors. Hand-written notes were included with many of the letters, thanking donors for their support. To date, over \$240,000 has been received from this mailing. Scholarship opportunities are beginning to be publicized for Cabrillo students and applications are open. Most scholarship applications will close in mid-March, at which point the selection committees will begin the task of reviewing applicants and

selecting recipients. Students will be notified of their scholarship awards in May and in most cases, the funds are disbursed at the beginning of the fall semester.

#### Faculty and Staff Grants

Ron Sekkel reported that the foundation offers three grant programs to support Cabrillo College faculty and staff: Faculty Grants for Student Success, Crocker Endowment Grants and Engineering and Applied Science Endowment. Recipients are selected through an annual proposal process that begins in the fall. This year, the Foundation awarded over \$178,000 in grants to Cabrillo faculty and staff, funding innovative projects that directly benefit our students. In late January, we celebrated these grant recipients at a reception held at the Sesnon House. Faculty and staff shared brief presentations about their projects, followed by a reception where attendees had the opportunity to connect over refreshments. The event had an outstanding turnout—twice the number of attendees compared to previous years—with many faculty members and donors joining us.

#### Heritage Club

Eileen Hill gave an overview of Planned Giving and the Heritage Club. Donors who include Cabrillo College in their estate plans and invited to be part of our Heritage Club. Once we learn of a donor's intent, we follow up to understand their connection to Cabrillo, their philanthropic interests, give them instructions on how to word their trust documents, and invite them to create a Memorandum of Charitable Intent (MOCI) for our records. We currently have 128 Heritage Club members and are inviting them to an annual lunch at the Sesnon House on March 12, 2025. This gathering gives us the chance to keep members updated and connected to the college.

#### (1) Balance Sheet

#### • Total Assets:

Total assets of \$60.6M are \$5.0M more than prior year primarily due to the increase in value of the assets in the investment accounts.

#### • Receivables:

Total pledges receivable are \$150K less than prior year.

#### • Liabilities:

Total Liabilities of \$1.9M are \$74K less than prior year.

#### Net Assets:

Total net assets of \$58.7M are \$5.1M more than prior year.

#### (2) Income Statement

#### • Revenue:

Total Revenue of \$8.5M is \$5.3M less than prior year. Earned income year to date of \$3.6M is \$3.5M less than prior year, primarily due to a decrease in investment income. Contributed income of \$4.9M is \$1.8M less than prior year, primarily due to a \$3.35M estate gift from Tom Sourisseau last year.

#### • Expenses:

Total Expenses of \$3.2M are \$66K more than prior year.

#### • Surplus/Deficit:

#### 2025-26 Proposed Operating Budget Compared to 2024-25 Projected Actual

#### **Revenue:**

The 2025-26 operating revenue of \$1,662,199 is projected to be \$37,249 higher than the 2024-25 projected actual operating revenue of \$1,624,950.

- Brown Advisory estimates \$225,000 in investment income (short/mid-term pools)
- Endowment Management Fee for 2025-26 based on projection for 2024-25. Projections going out 3 years based on \$2M in new endowed gifts at 1.5%

#### Expenses:

The 2025-26 operating expenses of \$1,496,999 are projected to be \$140,879 over the 2024-25 projected actual operating expense of \$1,356,120.

- \$83,332 increase in salaries, includes standard salary schedule increase
- \$35,744 payroll taxes and benefits increased due to increase in salaries, health benefits and training and conferences (in person)

#### **Operating Reserve**

The 24-25 projected surplus of \$268,830 will fulfill the 2025-26 operating reserve and we will have an additional \$172,044 to fulfill 100% of the Retiree Medical Benefit Liability. The exact amount will be updated prior to the next audit. The 2025-26 projected surplus is \$165,200. Projections show a surplus for the following three years.

#### **Recommended Motion**

The Finance and Investments Committee and the Executive Committee recommends to the Board of Directors to approve the proposed 2025-26 Operating Budget and allocation of surplus to fulfill the operating reserve and Retiree Medical Benefit liability.




Christina was born and raised in Hayward, CA. She holds and MPH from UC Berkeley, an MA from Santa Clara University, and a BA from San Jose State University.

Cabrillo is fortunate to have a robust scholarship program that helps alleviate some of the financial burdens students face, allowing them to reach their educational goals and achieve success.

#### SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

- Last year we awarded \$1.5 million in scholarships to nearly 1,600 students
- Recipient selection for the 2025 scholarship cycle is underway and the foundation is working closely with the Financial Aid office to administer nearly 450 scholarships in four different categories:
  - 1. **Department Scholarships**: Foundation works with 50+ staff and faculty members to ensure scholarships are awarded to eligible students
  - 2. **Organization/Donor Scholarships:** Foundation works with outside organizations and individual donors to create applications and/or supply eligible applicants from "general applicant pool", as well as provide guidance to selection committees and assistance in awarding scholarships.
  - 3. **General Scholarships**: Foundation provides Financial Aid office with a list of scholarships that are awarded through the General Scholarship application and selection process.
  - 4. **High School Scholarships (for incoming Cabrillo students):** Foundation and Financial Aid office work with local high schools, encouraging students to complete online applications. Foundation manages awarding process.
- This year's scholarship recipients will be notified of their awards by the Financial Aid Office in May and will receive instructions on obtaining their scholarship funds. Awards will be distributed at the beginning of the fall semester through an online banking system called BankMobile.
